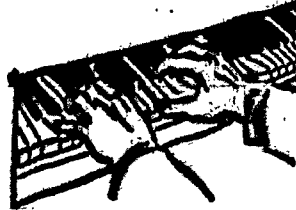

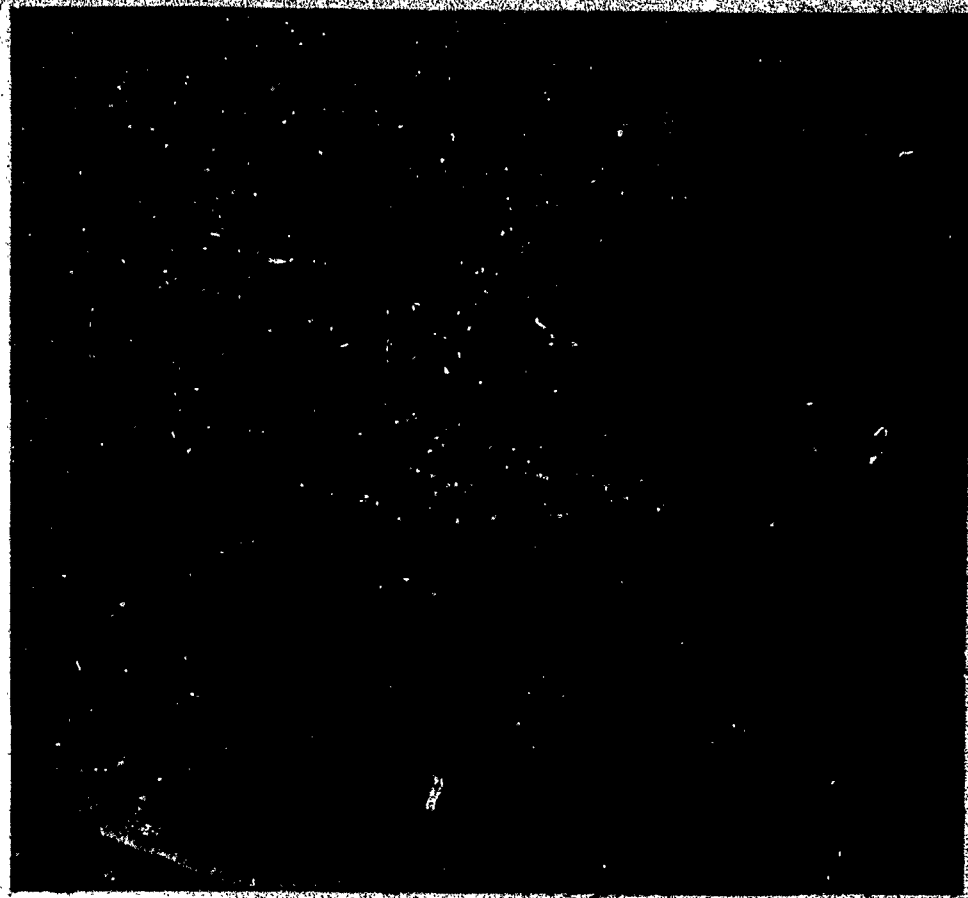

English Syllabus Revised In Jesuit High Schools

Rev. Cornelius J. Carr, S.J., director of studies for the Buffalo Province of the Society of Jesus and principal of McQuaid Jesuit High School, has appointed a three-man committee to make wide changes in the English curricula and approach to English study for Jesuit high schools in Rochester and Buffalo.

Working this summer at McQuaid, Rev. John A. St. George, S.J., principal of St. Mary's High School, and Rev. William J. O'Malley, S.J., principal of Woodstock College (Maryland) have drawn up the new syllabi and are now writing teaching manuals for a new approach to writing, poetry, fiction, essay, drama and mass media.

IN ACCORD with the suggestions of the Commission on English of the College Entrance Examination Board, the final examination in English for each of the four years will consist of three, essay questions, rather than the usual spread of 50 per cent multiple-choice, 25 per cent essay, questions and 25 per cent composition.

The unifying element of the course is communication, both written and visual, integrating reading, writing, viewing, acting and listening. The primary intent of the course is that, in all communication, whether the student is originating or receiving the idea, the means are fundamentally the same.

Granted that each genre—poetry, fiction, essay, drama, television, film—has its own particular characteristics, all must depend on the awareness of creator and receiver and on the

Papal Pleas Unheeded

Bogota — (NC) — A priest-editor criticized the U.S. approach to Latin America's problems and called for a removal of barriers in order to "reach an understanding which will satisfy both Americas."

Father Mario Revollo-Bravo, editor of the Bogota Catholic newspaper El Catolicismo, said in a recent editorial:

"Now is the time to leave aside what separates us and join forces in an effective continent-wide plan, especially for us who, regardless of barriers of language and technique, are brethren in the same Christian faith and have the same responsibility within the Church."

The people of the United States in their response to Latin America, are not putting into practice the appeals of papal social documents, but are "pre-occupied" with "taking the defensive against imminent danger," he said.

HE SAID that this "approach... if one can speak of an approach," was reflected at a seminar on Latin America at the annual convention (April 30 to May 3) of the Catholic Press

Association of the United States and Canada in Miami. Father Revollo-Bravo attended the convention as president of the Latin American Union of the Catholic Press.

Father Revollo-Bravo pointed out that the four or five spokesmen for Latin America at the session were all citizens of the United States.

"It is obvious that those who live in the powerful country to the north cannot hide their fear that the rest of the Latin American continent may fall into the hands of communism and, with the help of the Soviet Union, become in a short time a threat which could put the democracy of the United States in serious difficulties," he said.

"They have a right to react

like this, and it is a reasonable reaction; but there are reasons to doubt the correctness of the attitude they seem to adopt. Because rather than responding to the urgent appeals of the Supreme Pontiff in his encyclical Mater et Magistra and Pater in Terris on the duty of rich countries in relation to developing countries, they seem to be preoccupied with putting themselves on the alert and taking the defensive against an imminent danger."
