## Holy Childhood Given Approval Of Pope Paul

Pope Paul VI granted his personal protection to the Pontifical Association of the Holy Childhood last week according to the Rev. John F. Duffy, diocesan director, 50 Chestnut St., Rochester.

In a letter to Monsignor Adrian Bressolles, Director General of the Association in Paris, Archbishop Angelo Dell'Acqua, Subtitular Secretary of State, relayed the Holy Father's acceptance and desire to see the Holy Childhood spread still further in its work of helping mission children.

As did his predecessors Pope John XXIII and Pope Pius XII, the new Holy Father will now personally direct the work of the Holy Childhood that has National Offices in over 40 countries. More than 600 million arise around the world benefit from the prayers and sacrifices of the children in elementary parochial schools.

The Holy Childhood is a Pontifical Mission Aid Society, is one of only three societies under the direct supervision and control of the Holy Father himself. As such, it enjoys the sanction and blessing of the Head of the Church and can make its appeals in his name.

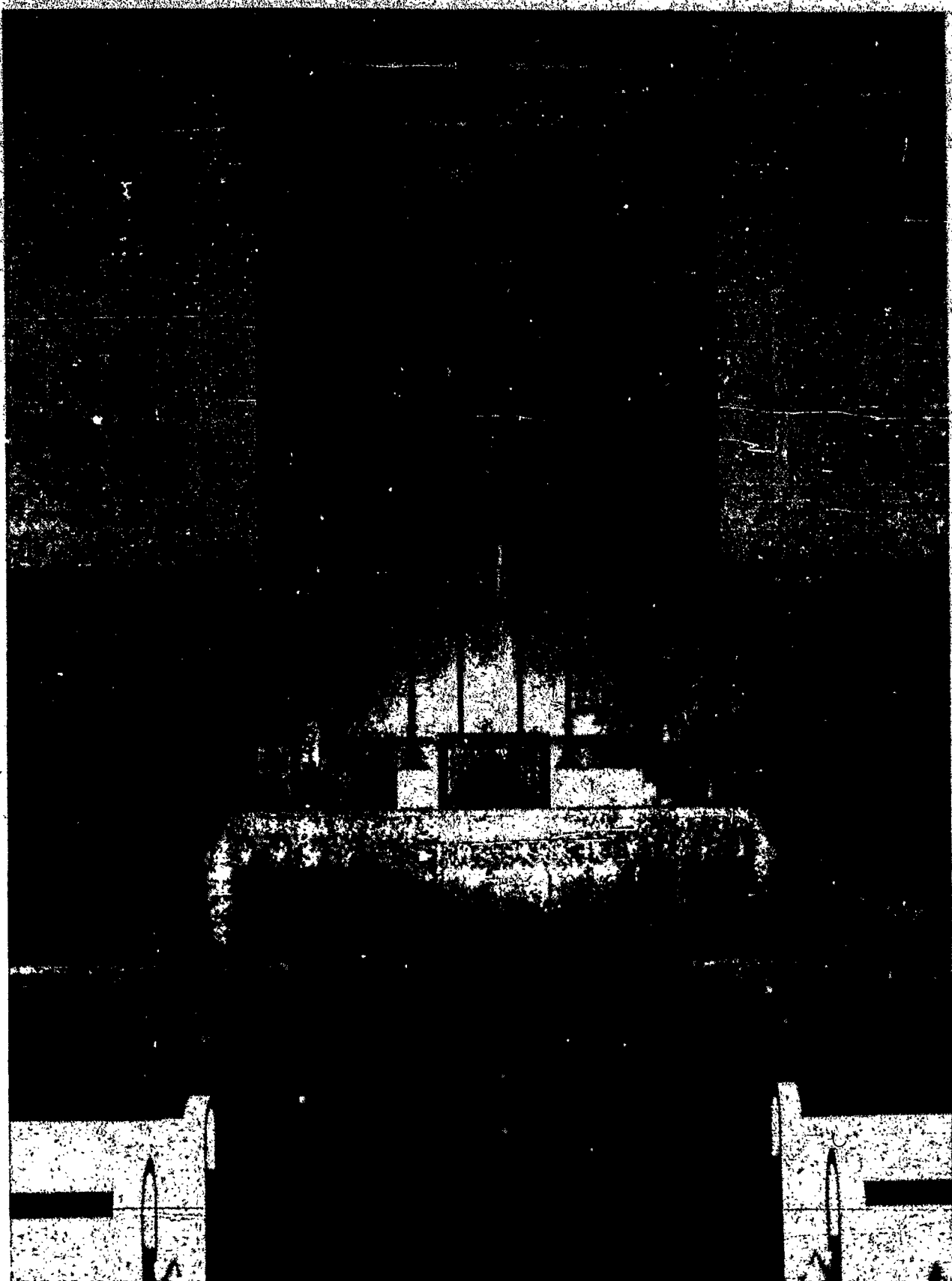
