Religious Units Hit Tax Rule

Washington (NC) — The Kennedy administration has left out of its revised tax-cut program a five per cent "floor" on itemized deductions to which religious groups strongly objected.

The five per cent rule, contained in the administration's original tax proposal of last January, was not the revamped tax plan given Congress by Secretary of Treasury Douglas Dillon.

Catholic Charities of the Chicago archdiocese was one of the organizations that vigorously objected to the five per cent limit on itemized deductions, stating that incentives for giving would be removed by its adoption.

Justice Expects Most Will Heed Prayer Ruling

Chicago—The author of the U.S. Supreme Court's decision against Bible reading and prayer in public schools predicted that most will heed the ruling.

Associate Justice Tom C. Clark said that if some places do not respect the opinion, he would challenge the religious practices which possibly reach the high court.

Clark appeared on a television discussion program here during the American Bar Association convention.

Answering questions put to him by other participants on the program, Clark said he got fewer than 100 letters after his opinion in the latest prayer case.

A year ago, he said, after the court's decision against religion in a 22-word nonsectarian prayer in New York public schools, he received more than 3,000 letters.

In the meantime, the United Press International reported that a nationwide survey conducted showed that many U.S. public schools will continue Bible reading and recitation of the Lord's Prayer this fall, despite the high court's decision.
