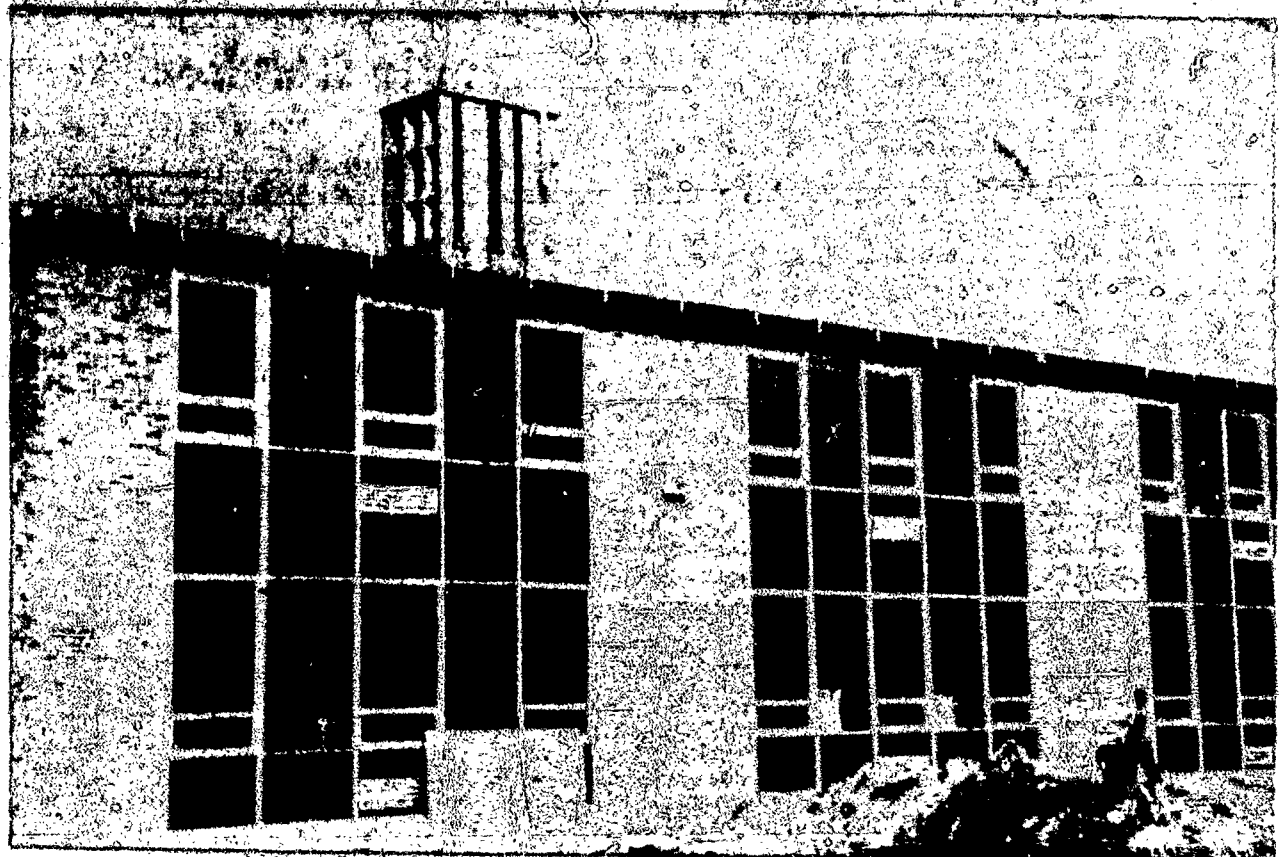
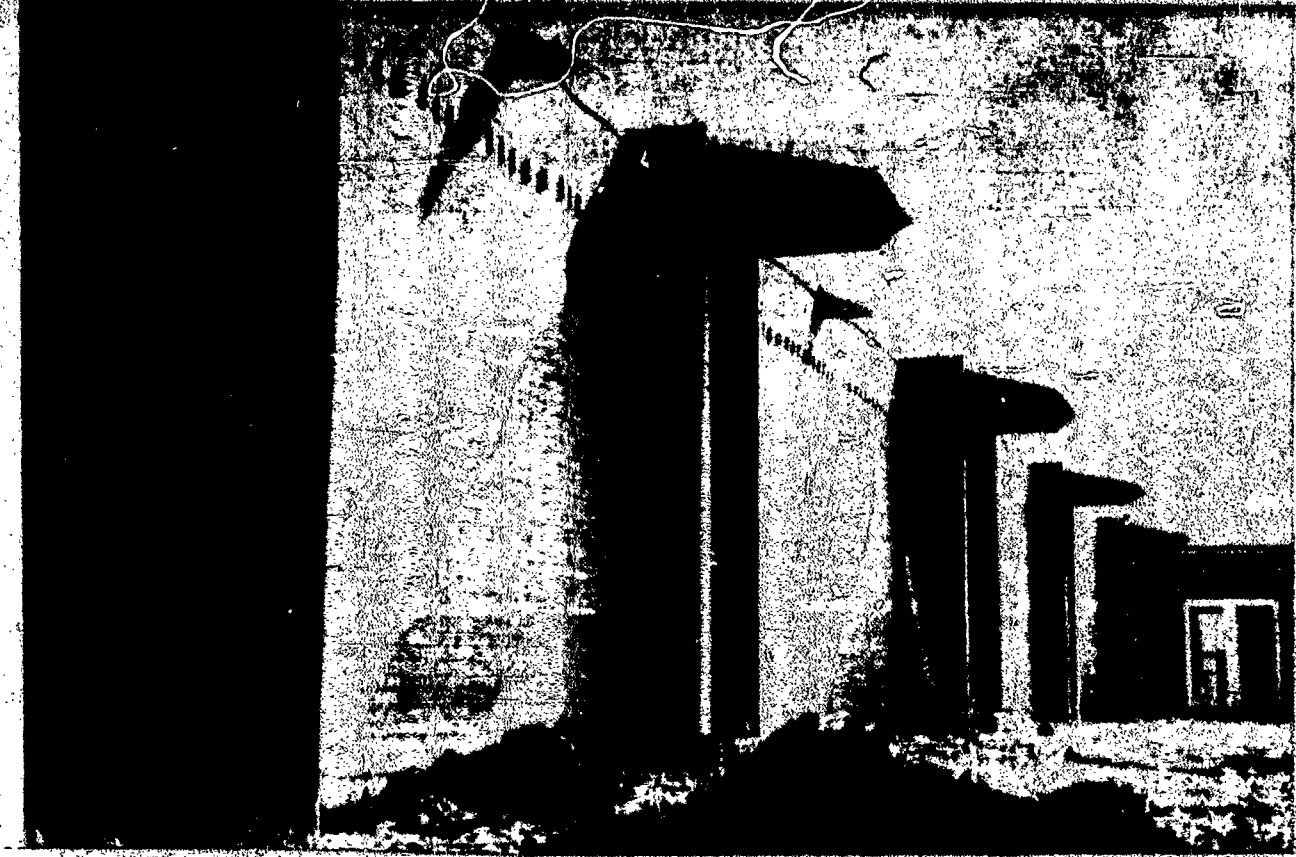

## Catholic Schools Enroll 58,224

School enrollment is up, all over. When the Catholic schools of the Diocese of Rochester open on Wednesday, Sept. 4 the estimated number of children reported in the class rooms will be 47,895 in the elementary schools and 10,329 in the high schools. The figures were given out at the diocesan school office, Rev. William M. Roche is diocesan superintendent of schools. Several factors are present in the estimate of the school enrollment. Besides the natural growth, the adding of another school year in Bishop Kearney and Cardinal Mooney high schools are noted. Children in the grammar schools will number 1,394 more this year. The increase in Monroe County will be 856, in other counties of the diocese 538. The high school estimate is 1,014 more in Monroe County, than last year, 217 more outside the See City area totaling 1,231 additional students. School building reports that the \$500,000 St. Ambrose School, Empire Boulevard and Culver Road, Irondequoit is well on its way to completion. Additions are going up in Our Lady of Mercy, Greece; St. Pius X, Chili; Good Shepherd, Henrietta and St. Joseph's, Penfield. Two other new schools, St. Lawrence School in Greece and St. John of Rochester, Peniston are expected to enroll 90 and 150 students respectively. On the college level St. John Fisher College for men has a \$1.5 million dormitory and \$500,000 gymnasium under construction. A dormitory and faculty house to cost \$1,970,000 are being erected on Nazareth College campus.

Dully, superintendent, Catholic Schools, Diocese of Rochester said in his annual re-opening of schools message. Mother Vincent Provincial S.S.M.L. of Philadelphia announced new appointments and assignments of the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate at St. Josaphat's, Rochester on Tuesday, Aug. 20. Sister Sebastian was appointed Superior and principal, while Sister Theodore, Sister Katherine, Sister Demetriada and Sister Clare were assigned to staff the parochial school. The Sisters will arrive tomorrow, Saturday, Aug. 24 in preparation for the new school year and will attend the Elementary Teacher's Conference and Principal's Meeting as scheduled according to the Official Rochester Diocesan School Calendar. A special send-off was given to another candidate to the Sisterhood from St. Josaphat's parish, Miss Rose Mary Roman, 181 Herald St., who began her novitiate at the Mount Mary Immaculate Novitiate at Ancaster, Ontario, Canada, the past week, joining her sister, Sister Anne who will be completing her novitiate in January 1964. The Feast of the Beholding of St. John the Baptist occurs on Thursday, Aug. 29. It is a strict day of abstinence for Byzantine Slavonic Catholics. The liturgical celebration of the feast, however, is transferred to Sunday, Sept. 1.
