'We Need To Look Together'

Soaring Population

Top officials of the Catholic Church will satisfy everybody to concern — a population "explosion" in areas steeped in grinding poverty and a soaring rate of abortions in traditionally Catholic nations of central Europe and Latin America.

He cited two reasons for this

Donald E. Straus, chairman of

the Planned Parenthood—World Population organization, said, "We need to look together for solutions to problems like these."

"We abhor abortion to the

same degree you do," he said. "Statistics show that in some areas in Europe and Latin America, abortions are now higher in number than actual births."

This situation shows people

need much more guidance and help in limiting family size or they turn to drastic solutions. "There isn't any one solution

that will satisfy everybody to concern — a population "explosion" in areas steeped in grinding poverty and a soaring rate of abortions in traditionally Catholic nations of central Europe and Latin America.

STRAUS ALSO said recent

efforts by Catholic research experts to develop greater accuracy in "rhythm" techniques and more frequent emphasis on "responsible" parenthood indicate a "growing sense of basic agreement" between the organization

he heads and the Catholic

Church. He admitted "We have no right to expect Catholics will change their theological position against outright birth control. We think we should develop a greater fluency in solving family limitation in accord with Catholic doctrine, not contrary to it."

Catholic Church officials con-

tinued to advise Catholic people to seek counsel on family size from Catholic agencies rather than at Planned Parenthood clinics.

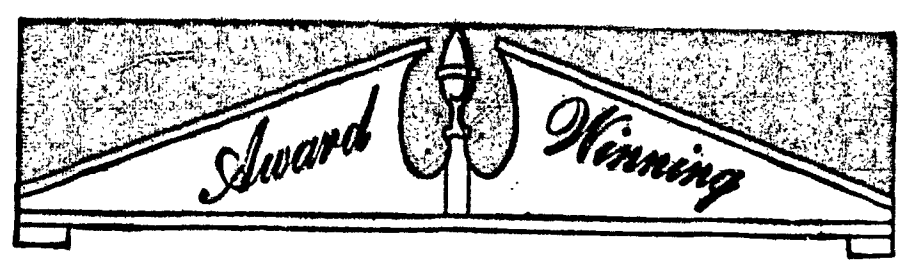

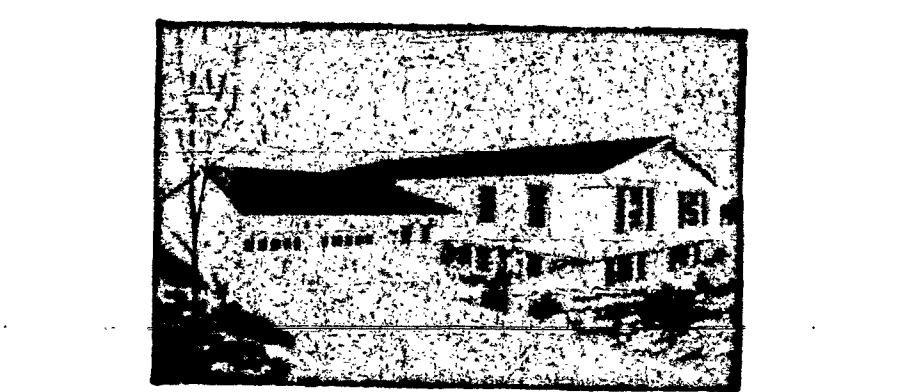

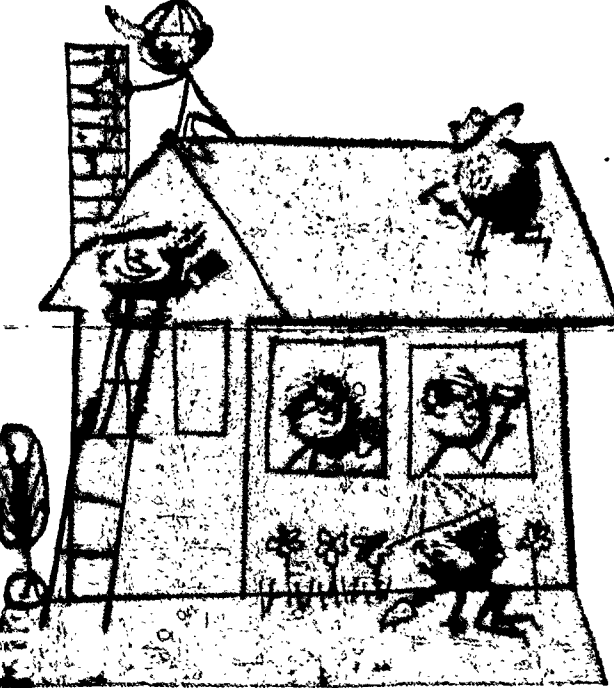
