

State Knights Of St. John Visit Shrine

Auburnville — The 11th Annual Pilgrimage to the Shrine of the North American Martyrs at Antwerpville sponsored by the New York Grand Commandery and Ladies Auxiliary Knights of St. John will be held Sunday, Oct. 6. Miss Bertha M. Kennel, president of the Grand President of the New York State Grand Ladies of St. John, will come to the Shrine at Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Utica, Albany, Schenectady and the New York metropolitan areas.

JOAN WEISBERGER of Rochester is State Chairman for this year's pilgrimage. Assisting the Grand President in the arrangements will be Dorothea Kelly, Albany the first vice-president; Blanche Trembley, the second vice-president; of Albany and Marie C. Bergdorf of Syracuse Grand Secretary. Miss Marie M. Mahoney of Schenectady, Grand Treasurer.

The pilgrimage on Sunday will begin with the Rosary through the shrine grounds at 1:45 p.m. Special color guards of the Knights of St. John and the various commanderies will lead the procession. At 2:00, the Stations of the Cross will begin and end at the Hill of Prayer, where the first Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament will be given.

The procession to the Ravine will then be formed and proceed to the Ravine where a special pilgrimage sermon will be preached by Rev. Thomas J. Coffey, S.J., the vicar-postulator of the Cause of Venerable Kateri Tekakwitha, who was born at Auréville and the first Benediction offered.

VENERATION of the Relics of the Martyrs will take place in the Coliseum at 3:45 p.m. The pilgrimage Mass will begin at 4:15 p.m., at which a special choir of the Knights of St. John will sing. The pilgrimage sermon will be preached by the Rev. Anthony G. Schirman, S.J., the administrative assistant at the shrine and editor of the pilgrim.

Tribute To Mrs. Conte, 35 Years Of Service

A "Farewell Party" was held for Mrs. Dominic Conte on Sept. 5 by the St. Francis Xavier Altar Society. Her departure for California four days later terminates 35 years of vestment making for her parish.

Mrs. Conte began donating her sewing talent to St. Francis back in 1928 as a member of the Order of Martha. When this group became defunct, the Altar Society of St. Francis Xavier Parish was formed by the late Father David Singerhoff. Mrs. Conte was named its first president — a post which she held 26 years until for reasons of health, it was necessary for her husband to move to California to be with their only daughter.

Under her direction the Altar Society raised funds to purchase all materials for use at the altar. All altar cloths and altar linens were made by this group. The more intricate sewing of the vestments was pretty much left to the talented hands of Mrs. Conte herself. It is estimated that through her unselfish giving of her time and talent, she has saved the parish close to \$30,000 in cost of vestments.

As a going away gift to the parish she made a complete set of gold vestments that would be valued at about \$1,500.

The words of the psalm, a spokesman said, could truly summarize this "valiant woman's" whole life, "I have loved O Lord, the beauty of Thy house, and the place where Thy glory dwelleth."
