**College Students' Liturgy Weekend**

College students of the Rochester diocesan area will attend a "liturgical weekend" at Nazareth College Nov. 1 to 3 to study current projects of renewal in the Church.

Very Rev. Gerard S. Sloan, of the Catholic University of America, and president of the National Liturgical Conference will give three talks on Sunday, concluding the day of the weekend.

Bishop Kearney will speak at luncheon Sunday noon and Basilian Father John F. Madden of St. Michael's College, Toronto, will give the keynote talk Friday afternoon. All speakers and panel discussions will probe ways to make Catholic liturgy more meaningful for students at both Catholic and secular colleges.

**Christmas Seals To Aid Mission Work**

Children in parochial schools of the Rochester Diocese will aim for a four million goal in sale of Christmas seals, Father John Duffy, director of the Propagation of the Faith Society announced this week.

The Christmas seals are part of the Holy Childhood program to raise funds for mission and relief work. A special award of a set of three wall plaques for the sale of 100 seals; a first prize of a crucifixion plaque for the sale of 100 seals; a second prize of a Holy Childhood calendar for the sale of 75 seals.

The 1963 seals, arranged in booklets of 100, were delivered to the schools of the diocese during the past week.

**Dispensations On Three Days**

Bishop Kearney has dispensed Catholics in the Rochester Diocese from the laws of fast and abstinence on two days—Friday, Nov. 29, the day after Thanksgiving, and Saturday, Nov. 30, the feast of Our Lady's Immaculate Conception.

Catholics are also excused from the usual Friday abstinence law on Nov. 1, feast of All Saints, a holiday. Halloween, Oct. 31, formerly a fast day, is no longer observed at such.

**Bath Parish Fund Drive This Sunday**

Very Rev. Msgr. George A. Conroy, vicar general of the Rochester Diocese, will be the principal speaker when the 30-member advance solicitation committee in the \$80,000 minimum goal campaign of St. Mary's Church, Bath, gather for their kickoff. The dinner meeting is slated for 4:30 p.m. this Sunday evening, October 28, in the Rectory.

UNDER THE leadership of William W. Dupont, chairman, committeemen will conduct a limited solicitation of pledges from fellow parishioners on Sunday afternoon, October 27, between the hours of 2:00 and 4:00 p.m. Assisting, as group leaders, will be Guy S. Cattell, Thomas R. Connolly, Benjamin Eagan, John J. Stuloids and Michael Candelup.

Objective of the campaign is financing of a second-story addition to complete the parish school. Plans call for three more classrooms, a library and audio-visual room on the upper level. With the accomplishment of the current program the school will have a full complement of eight grades and kindergarten as well as all necessary facilities to accommodate an anticipated enrollment in excess of 400 students with the school opening in September, 1964.

**Elmira Church To Be Restored**

A Restoration Appeal is being launched at SS. Peter and Paul's Church, Elmira, to raise the sum of \$35,000 to renovate the "mother" church of Elmira.

The appeal is being directed by Edward F. Leary of Foley Associates Inc. of Rochester, William S. Bennett and Joseph E. Rice, trustees of the parish, are chairmen of the project.

Because of the age of the church, a complete restoration job has been found necessary for the exterior. The building will be given a complete sandblast, deteriorated brick will be replaced, mortar joints will be out and repointed with water-proof pointing mortar, and the surface will be given two saturating coats of silicon. If the appeal is successful, the work will be started in the Spring of 1964.

The present church was begun in 1854. On July 10, 1857, Bishop John Timon came from Buffalo to consecrate and dedicate the church. It is the heartfelt desire of the parishioners of Saint Peter and Paul's Church to restore and preserve this beautiful gothic edifice which has served so many people of Elmira over the past century," according to the Rev. Bartholomew O'Brien, pastor.

In the parish bulletin of last Sunday, the following item was printed: "Today we beg God the Holy Spirit to receive our heartfelt prayers and sacrifices, through the gracious hands of Our Lady, and to send back to earth, through those same gracious hands, an abundance of grace for our Restoration Appeal."

**Corning CYA Lists Retreat**

Corning—A program which will involve three days of religious activities has been planned by the Catholic Youth Adoration Unit in the Corning area. Since this program begins on Nov. 1, the Feast of All Saints, it has been characterized as an "All Saints Retreat."

The three parishes in Corning have been chosen as the local for the different events. The retreat is open to all 9th and 12th grade Catholic students in the Corning-Painted Post-Addison area.

THE RETREAT will be conducted by the Rev. Theophanus Murphy, S.A., rector of St. John's Adoration Seminary at Weston Falls. It will open with the attendance of all C.Y.A. members at the 5:15 parish Mass at St. Mary's Church on Friday, Nov. 1. Following the Mass the members will be served a supper in St. Mary's gym.

The first of two retreat talks will be given at 7 p.m. in St. Mary's Church. Following this first talk the young people will have an opportunity to go to confession. At least 1000 retreatants will be available for this purpose. At 8:15 p.m. another talk will be given by Father Murphy, and the evening will conclude with Benediction and the Act of Reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus at 9 p.m.

On the second day of the retreat, Nov. 2, the C.Y.A. members will assist at Mass at 7 a.m. at St. Patrick's Church. Father Murphy will speak to the group once again following the Mass. In the evening special Rosary devotions will be held for the C.Y.A. members in each of the parishes.
