### Debate League Begins Session

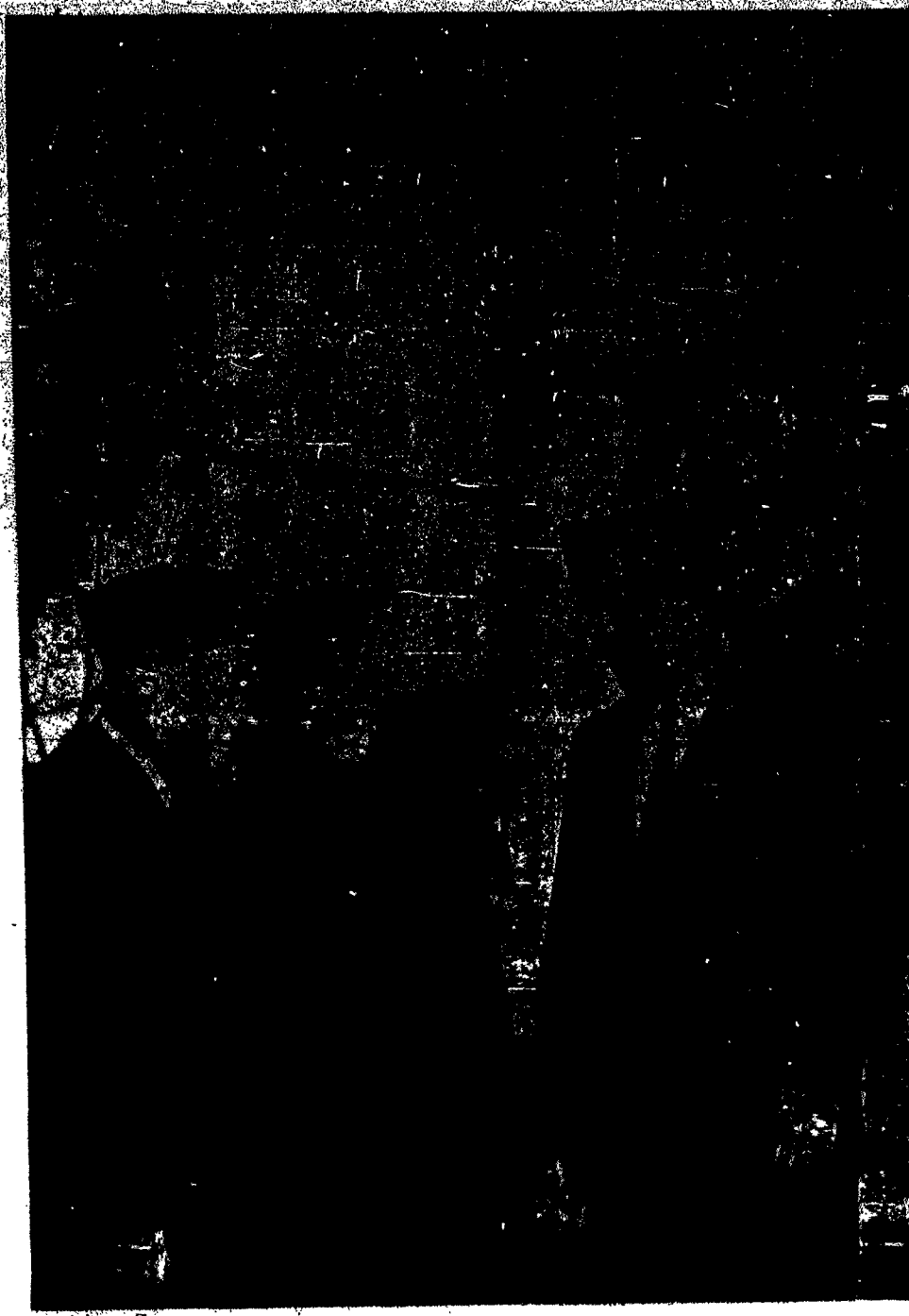
