Disc Notes

From Paul Contestable

Henry Jerome, the man who started a fabulous new sound with his "Brown Eyes" records, has at the same time made a new sound and take it to the next level. In his new album, Vocal Velvet, he presents a delightful new concept in use of group voices combined with orchestra. The results are a collection of clean, all-time great songs presented in a manner that is pleasing to listen to, dancer to or just to "Hum Along With Henry."

Jerome treats the voices as a richly vibrant instrument, carrying the melody and phrases sounds similar to words although never using actual words. The provocative sound that results is radiant and imaginative. Dick Jacobs did an excellent job on the arrangements.

New excitement is captured in the creative treatment of the voices by Jerome and without doubt, this new sound, which will become a hit and will lead other records in the series. From the bright and breezy tempo of "Taking a Chance on Love and Walkin' My Baby Back Home," to the dramatic and staccato "Mack the Knife," and the poignant "Where or When," Jerome and I Left My Heart in San Francisco, the album is a showcase of pleasant and compelling sound.

Also included are "Once in a While, For All We Know, They Don't Believe Me, Arrivederci Roma, I Understand and Au Wildersein." Vocal Velvet is a record to please every music lover. (Decca)

One of the brightest young stars in the musical firmament, Peter Duchin, places the emphasis on exceptional standards all with a gilt edge invitation to dance in his new album, "We Could Have Danced All Night."

His brilliant and distinctive style is constantly at work creating music that is ideally danceable. With his piano and orchestra, Duchin presents 12 songs, each an invitation to dance from the dreamy and romantic "As Long As He Needs Me to the swinging arrangement of "Mack the Knife."

His version of "C'est Si Bon" is as charming as a visit to Paris; his "Everything's Coming Up Roses" is as exciting as opening night on Broadway; and his

The Party's Over is stirringly reminiscent of all the pleasant memories of the past.

Other tunes included in this top-notch album are "I Can't Give You Anything But Love, Man," "You Eye Badie Mellow," "Can Can Hokey Prelude to the Bossa Nova," "Days of Wine and Roses and I Could Have Danced All Night." (Decca)

Guy Lombardo and his royal Canadiana have come up with another fine album, keyed to the delightful melodies and lyrics of a dozen of the most popular folk songs in his past releases, Golden Folk Songs For Dancing. A truly outstanding collection of musical Americana, the unmistakable sound of "the sweetest music this side of heaven" is enhanced by the talented Millington Folk Singers and vocals by Cliff Grass and Bill Flanagan.

Waltzes, foxtrots and rumbas are featured in the most delightful sound and tempo heard since the invention of the bandstand. From "Molly Malone, a bit of the old sod long since transplanted to these shores, to the Jamaica "Farewell and the hauntingly beautiful Song with its Caribbean beat, Shenandoah, all receive the distinctive Lombardo touch.

Also featured on this Decca album are "Puttin' on the Style, Old Paint, Midnight Special, Bill Wevill, The Eric Canal, Greensleeves, (Wreck of the John B), So Long (It's Good to Know You) and Good Night, Irene."

The Lombardo style is stamped — tunelessly and tastefully — on every song.

Mr. Ragtime Meets Mr. Hazy meets on a new Coral release with Joe "Fingers" Carr and "Big" Tiny Little. A strutting ragtime piano mixes it up with a swaggering barrel-house box in a battle between two highly individualistic and competent keyboard comedians. A bouncing, toe-tapping album of music that is solid rhythm.

Tunes included are Down Yonder, Cleopatra Rag, Dardanelles, Mandy, Play a Simple Melody, Nocture For Honky-Tonk Piano, Sonny Boy, Washington and Lee Swing, Nola, Little Rock Getaway and a sensational version of Arriba Aruba, which alone is worth the price of the record.

O-neh-Da Vineyard Aids Seminary For Missioners

A peaceful slope high above Hemlock Lake affords a travel-poster setting for the O-neh-da vineyards and wine cellars. Founded in 1872 by Bishop Bernard McQuaid, the first Catholic Bishop of Rochester... the O-neh-da Vineyard was for many years operated by the Diocese of Rochester for the benefit of St. Bernard's Seminary.

Initially the production of the winery was devoted entirely to altar wines. In Bishop McQuaid's own words, "We can refer to the peaceful slopes of Hemlock Lake and in the cultivation of the grapes help priests to say Mass with wine that is wine."

At that time, there were just 20 acres of vineyards, and a rehabilitation job of substantial proportions was undertaken in 1936. That year marked the arrival of wine maker, Leo Goering, a graduate of the Institute for Wine Research at Geisenheim am Rhein, Germany.

This year increased production and storage facilities have made it possible for this historic winery to market pure grape table wines. This was done once before in the late 30's and early 40's but lack of storage facilities led to the withdrawal of the wines from the market.

TABLE WINE varieties will include Burgundy, Haut Sauterne, Port and Delaware. The O-neh-da Delaware is unique among the varieties produced by the New York State vintners and has always been most popular with 60 acres of vineyard devoted to growing the Delaware grape.

The laws of the Church require that sacramental wines be produced entirely from the juice of the grape. Use of sugar, water, alcohol, other than pure grape brandy, is prohibited. The same wine-making procedures are followed in making O-neh-da Table Wines which are being offered for sale this year in Rochester and neighboring villages.
