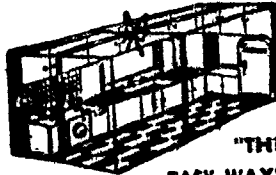

'Instant Philanthropy'

Ancient Manuscripts Presented to Local Colleges

Los Angeles philanthropist Stanley Slotkin, founder and board chairman of Abbey Rents, world's largest rental organization, was guest speaker of the Commerce Club's noon luncheon meeting, Nov. 18, at the Chamber of Commerce.

At that time, Slotkin presented valuable, ancient manuscripts to four Rochester colleges. Accepting the gifts for their schools were: Mr. Thomas Strader, Rochester Institute of Technology; Sister Saint Catherine, Nazareth College; Very Rev. Charles J. Lavery, St. John Fisher College; and Dr. V. E. Devadutt, Colgate Rochester Divinity School; Dr. Elwood Valler, president, Roberts Wesleyan College.

Called antiphonaries, they are illuminated pages from a huge choir book believed to have been used in the Cathedral of Seville about 1500. Such choir books were used in churches before printed books became common. With a choir boy turning pages at the lectern, a large group of singers could follow the manuscript text.

Each of the pages presented to the local colleges is made of sheepskin, is 25 by 36 inches in size and valued at approximately \$1,000. Hand-lettering on both sides of the pages is in Gothic, with the ink remarkably well-preserved.

The 16th century manuscripts are just a few of the world's art and literary treasures that Slotkin has discovered, during his extensive world travels, and subsequently given to educational institutions and churches throughout the country.

These particular finds of Slotkin's are from Spain, where he had gone at the U.S. government's request to assist in a chair factory having production difficulties. In the course of re-

organizing the plant, workmen broke through into a sealed room 30 feet underground. In the room were a number of church relics, including two huge choir books mounted on heavy wooden stands, that had been buried over 200 years. As a gesture of gratitude, the factory owner gave Slotkin one of the books, containing 80 pages. Unaware of their value at that time, Slotkin packed the pages in with some dirty laundry that he mailed home.

A frequent visitor to Europe and the Holy Land in search of ancient artifacts, Slotkin became well known at the Vatican where he did extensive research in the archives and libraries.

A few years ago a Catholic friend of his, well-known in the Los Angeles area, was in Rome and sought an audience with the Pope. When he was refused, he made a telephone call

and announced himself as a friend of Stanley Slotkin. That afternoon he saw the Pope. "It's amazing what a little Jew can do at the Vatican," Slotkin quipped during an interview.

The Rome "connection" was Alfonso Felici, whose family for many years has been official photographers of the Vatican.

Soon after the atomic bomb ended the war in Japan, Mr. Slotkin was a visitor in Hiroshima where he saw the effects of radiation on the mutilated bodies of the survivors.

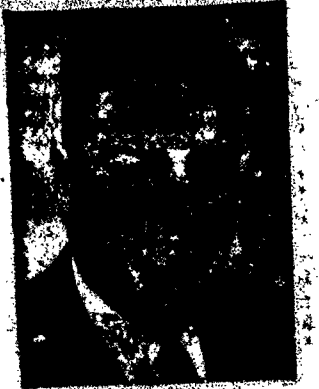
For the few that they were able to help, Japanese doctors were using a new plastic, not yet known in the U.S.

Returning home, Slotkin introduced the new plastic to local medical men and set into operation the Abbey Rents Foundation Clinic in Los Angeles. At this time, literally thousands of people have received free cosmetic plastic surgery to correct deformities that previously blighted their lives, physically and mentally.

Slotkin, who liberally originated the rent-everything idea when he opened the first Abbey Rents, on his 18th birthday, in Kansas City, Mo., was in Rochester for the company's 45th branch store's opening at 283 Joseph Ave., on Nov. 18. Abbey Rents Rochester, a subsidiary of Rothman Furniture, Inc., will specialize in the rental and sale of party, sickroom and hospital equipment.

Education Unit Elects Basilian
