

Aquinas Cagers Slate 20 Games

Rev. Cyril F. Carter, C.S.B., Athletic Director, has announced the 1963-64 Varsity basketball schedule for the Little Irish of Aquinas Institute. According to Father

Carter, Aquinas opens tonight in Penn Yan against Penn Jr High School. Game time is set for 8:15 p.m. with a Joyce pre-game at 8:30.

This season's schedule features 20 games including two diocesan basketball tournaments to be held at Canastota High School on Dec. 29 and 30.

AQUINAS WILL also compete in the annual Catholic Diocesan Basketball Tournament to be held at the end of the basketball season. The Irish hoopers are defending champions of the Diocesan crown.

Making his debut as coach of Aquinas will be John Kelly, former Assumption University basketball star who was named to the staff of the Basilian Fathers school in September.

Regular season play will find the Irish at home for 8 games and on the road for 8 games.

No new teams are scheduled for Aquinas this season with the possible exception of teams to be faced in the Christmas tournament.

The Community War Memorial will be the scene of two games for the Irish. An Aquinas-McQuaid clash is set for Dec. 21 and on Jan. 4, the Irish will meet Edison Tech.

Aquinas will open at home on Friday, Nov. 29, against LeRoy on the Dewey Avenue hardwood.

Coach John Kelly had only three letter men returning. He is building around 6-foot-6 Tom Pastorius, speedy Frank Wosnick, Don Bozell and rugged Steve Herbert.

According to reports Aquinas will have balance, size, speed and, in addition, good shooters.

Records Fall As McQuaid Wins Eight

Three school records by 16-year old senior fullback Tom Brennan highlighted McQuaid's football status for the Knights' winner 8-0 season.

Brennan, a 180-pounder from 1720 Jackson Road, Penfield, set new marks in scoring (89), carries (107), and yards rushing (533). His point total, coming on 10 touchdowns and 9 extra points broke the mark of 60, set by Bill Meagher in 1957 and tied by Mike Wolford in 1958.

Surprisingly, Brennan had no monopoly on McQuaid's ground gaining laurels. Senior fullback Joe Connellan, a 158-pounder from 122 Woodbine Ave., East Rochester, topped Brennan's yards-per-carry figure by gaining 460 yards on 74 tries for a 6.2 mark, compared to the fullback's 5.9. And junior Don Wegman, of 760 Long Pond Rd., Greece, with 269 yards on 35 carries, averaged them both with 8.3.

Next in line in yards rushing was halfback Mike Spiegel, a junior of 20 South St., Pittsford, with 100 yards on 34 carries for a 2.9 average.

IN SCORING, Connellan was runner-up with 41 points, followed by Wegman's 24 and Spiegel's 14.
