Catholic Women's Club To Hear Fisher Head

Members of the Catholic Women's Club will meet at the Sheraton Hotel for their 14th annual Communion-Breakfast on Sunday, Dec. 1, at 11 a.m. Following the breakfast Miss Mary A. Sheehan, former principal of Monroe High School, will introduce the Very Rev. Charles J. Lavery, C.S.B., president of St. John Fisher College.

FATHER LAVERY will be remembered for the part he played in the recent meeting of members of the World Council of Churches when he acted as host to about 50 Protestant and Orthodox leaders at a luncheon at St. John Fisher College which symbolized the growing friendship among Christian churches.

At this historic luncheon the present Anglican Bishop of Rochester, England, a member of the Central Committee of the World Council of Churches, offered a prayer before the meal, "that we may recover in Thee what we have lost in ourselves." A council spokesman later indicated the luncheon was a "first in relationships between Roman Catholics and World Council of Churches members."

Father Lavery has been president of St. John Fisher College since August, 1958, second president of the twelve year old institution he came to Rochester from St. Michael's College, Toronto, where he was vice-president and registrar. Father Lavery received his master's degree in philosophy from the University of Toronto and has doctorate in political science and international law at the University of Chicago.

He taught mathematics and science at Aquinas Institute in 1940. Both the college and the high school are operated by the Basilian Brothers.

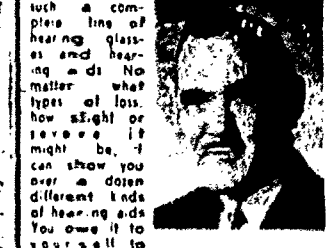
