

Oratoricals Slated By State K.C.

Members of the 1963 state-wide Oratorical Contest sponsored by the New York State Council, Knights of Columbus, is announced by Mrs. Joseph Edward L. Kinnear, state chairman, 100 Second Ave., White Plains, N.Y.

Any Catholic boy or girl who graduates in January or June 1963, from an accredited high school, public or private, may compete. Participants must first compete in council contest.

The winner will advance to district competition and compete with the area finals. Area winners will compete at the State Convention to be held in New York City on Friday, May 22, 1963.

A TOTAL of \$1,000.00 will be awarded in the state finals. This will consist of \$4,000.00 in scholarships and \$1,000.00 in U.S. Grant Bonds. First place winner will receive a \$2,000.00 scholarship and second place a \$1,000.00 scholarship and third a \$1,000.00 scholarship.

A selection of 2 finalists will be made for presentation of U.S. Grant Bonds, with each receiving a bond in value of \$200.00. All district contests must be concluded by March 22, 1963 and area contests April 5, 1963.

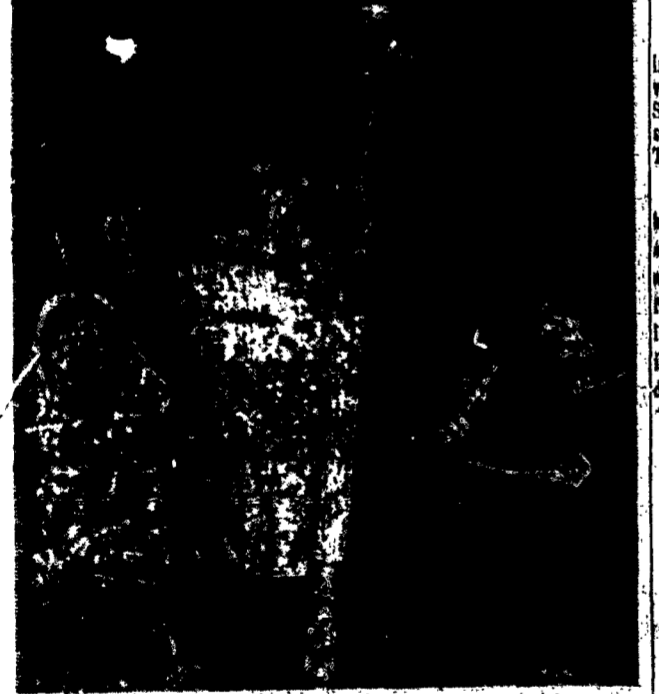


