

Aquinas - McQuaid Game Saturday

Through out the term, Aquinas and McQuaid are the two top teams in the area. High basketball rivalry scheduled for the Community War Memorial Saturday, Dec. 21.

Game time is set for 8:15 p.m. with a preliminary between the schools' junior varsity squads starting at 6:30 p.m.

Coach Ken Jones, Knights appear to be slight favorites on the basis of games played this season. McQuaid has a 2-0 record, while coach Jim Kelly's Irish are 2-1 and 2-0 in the season.

But both squads are expected to be at a season-high pitch, and past performances are poor indicators in this rivalry.

Last year, for instance, McQuaid came within four points of defeating the heavily favored Irish.

What is more significant is the fact that McQuaid's junior varsity defeated the Aquinas junior varsity last year, 45-40. Moreover, Jones used a handful of sophomores on his varsity team last season that gave the Irish a run for their money in the Diocesan tournament.

The Knights have 3 returning lettermen bolstered by a number of juniors with game experience. The Irish also count 3 lettermen on their squad.

In 1962 the Irish and the Knights broke even with the McQuaid quintet winning the Diocesan tournament semifinal in March, 1962, and Aquinas winning the December game, 1962.

In the overall rivalry, however, Aquinas holds a big 2-1

lead. The series began in March of 1959 with Aquinas winning 65-42.

Although McQuaid is a favorite on paper, this has little meaning on the court.

Aquinas has scored 323 points in four games, while allowing 235. McQuaid accumulated 236 points in the same number of games with 142 counters points to the opposition. There has been no common foe.

The Knights have won over Natavia, 70-57; Madison, 70-63; and Jefferson, 62-50, while losing to Lyons, 63-53.

Aquinas owns wins over Le Roy, 64-54; and St. Michaels of Turin, 107-87. They have lost to Warren, 74-55; and to Notre Dame of Udon, 80-68.

Tony Leonard, 6-foot-3 junior, leads the McQuaid attack with 30 points in four games for a 26 points average. He'll probably be teamed in the starting lineup by Sam Iannacone, Lance Camp, Mike Spiegel and John Stanley with Joe Miller and Bob Brady possible starters.

Camp has 45 points in four outings. Stanley is primarily an outside shooter with a good scoring eye. Leonardo and Iannacone play the inside and both are McQuaid's leading rebounders.

Also figuring to see action for the Knights is Gerry Bunge, Iannacone and Miller are captains of the McQuaid team.

For Coach John Kelly's Irish, the No. 1 performer is 6-foot-2 Jim Caverly who has scored 61 points in four games for a 15.25 average. Caverly will be joined by Tom Farnsworth, Steve Horvath, Frank Wornick and Jim Catone in the Irish starting lineup. Farnsworth, the tallest at 6-foot-11, is the second leading Aquinas scorer; Herbert a valuable outside shooter and Catone the floor general at 6 feet. Also expected to see action is Bill Welton, Bob Keegan, Dominic Roswell and Kevin Barrett. Although Barrett is but 5-foot-11 inches, he is a giant on defense.

Kelly likes to use the fast break building his offensive attack on accurate passing, constantly keeping the ball moving.

The Knights press often and enjoy a 50 per cent shooting average. Jones has a particularly strong defensive club.

Considerable interest is expected in the junior varsity fray. Don White, making his debut as McQuaid's Jayvee coach, has an impressive 3 and 1 record. Aquinas is also 3 and 1. The Irish juniors are coached this year by Ed Galvanese who played for the Aquinas varsity in 1962.

Tickets for the game are available at both schools and at the box office of the War Memorial. A capacity crowd is expected.
