The reason she was not better is because she is suffering from a hidden sin of guilt. Multiplying their sins and rebellion against the law of God, they reach a point where life becomes intolerable, and they are no longer worth living for whom Christ died.

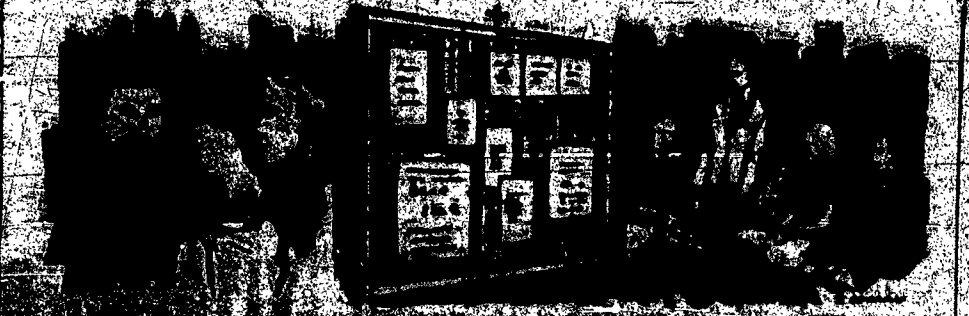
For those who are not mentally sick, but are suffering from grave sins, the sure is in atonement, in reparation, in the making up for guilt by penance. In his play, "The Cocktail Party," T. S. Eliot makes Celia Copplestone say in her confession to the psychiatrist:

"It's not the feeling of anything I've ever done which I might get away from, or of anything in me I could get rid of, but of emptiness, of failure toward someone, of something, outside of my self; and I don't know who it is, it's that the word"

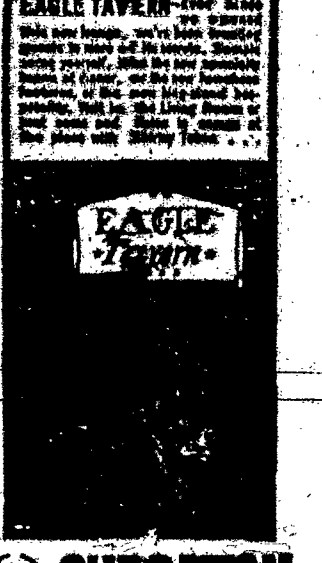
