

## Dorothy Chernuck Joins Papal Volunteer Corps

Cornell—Miss Dorothy Chernuck, co-producer and assistant director of the Cornell Summer Theatre since the 1955 season, is withdrawing from active participation in the theater in order to join the program of assistance for Latin America.

MISS CHERNUCK, who lives in New York City, will leave Cornell in the coming week to begin a six-month period with the Papal Volunteers. The organization, known as PAVLA, is sponsored by the Church. In operation, it is similar to the Peace Corps.

Miss Chernuck expects to spend at least the next two years in Brazil. She will spend the next four months in Petropolis, Brazil, learning Portuguese and then working as a technical expert in theater.

PAVLA, organized in 1960, already has more than 100 volunteers in 10 Latin American countries, she said.

The Cornell Summer Theatre operation will be continued by Miss Chernuck's co-producer, Oscar K. Lerman, also of New York City. It is planned to produce four or five resident company productions next summer, and a director will be brought in for them, it was explained.

The remainder of the production will be working shows presented by touring companies. This division of the season between resident and touring productions has been in effect in recent years.

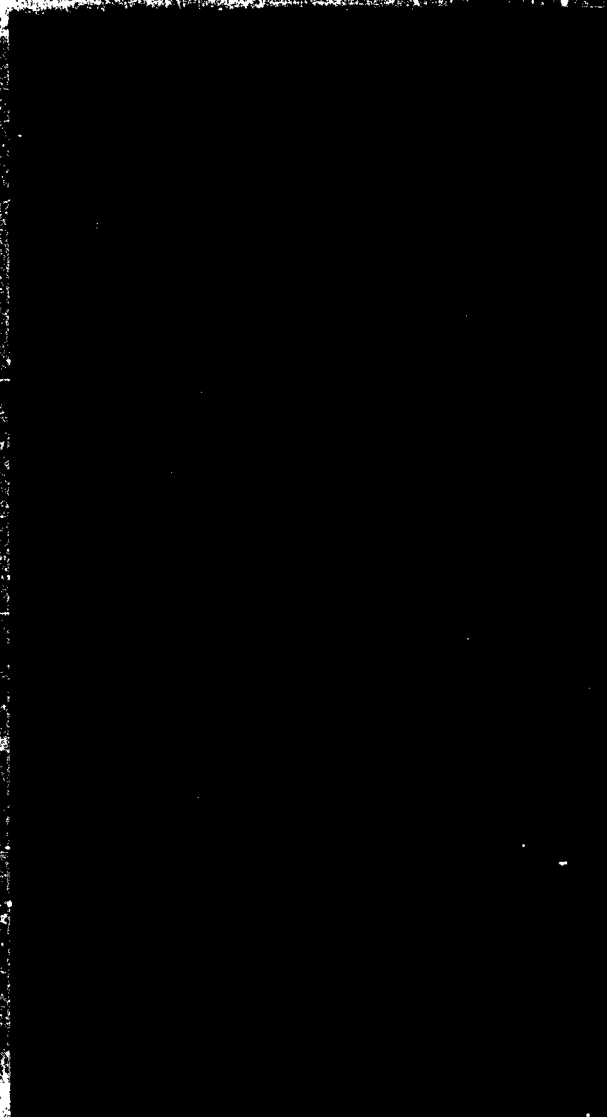

Star of such Broadway hits as "Mary of Scotland," "Victoria Regina," "Milk and Honey" and "Time Remembered," Miss Hayes will live at a Catholic University dormitory during the three-week rehearsal and try-out run of "Miss Dove," which begins Jan. 24.

A special benefit premiere will be held Jan. 22 to aid the building fund for a planned \$1.5 million theatre on the Catholic University campus.
