Chicago — (RNS) — William Morrow and Company of New York has been named winner of the 1963 Thomas More, Assisi Hon Medal for publishing "The Birthday King" by Gabriel Fielding. The novel, widely discussed, portrays a German family and its friends swept into the horrors, chaos and betrayals of the Nazi era. Named after St. Thomas More, 16th century British Catholic lawyer and martyr, the award is made annually to the outstanding contribution to Catholic literature.

Menu Planning Classes Soon

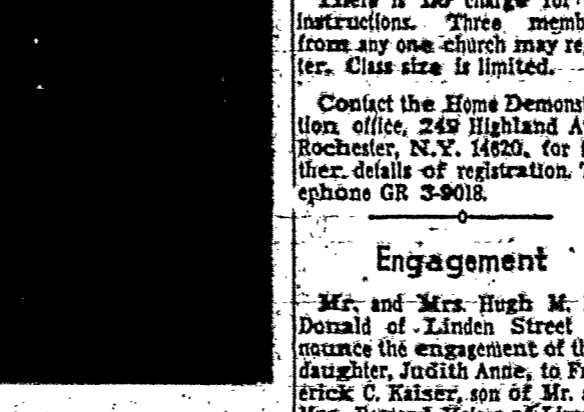
