Louis J. Neary Requiem Held

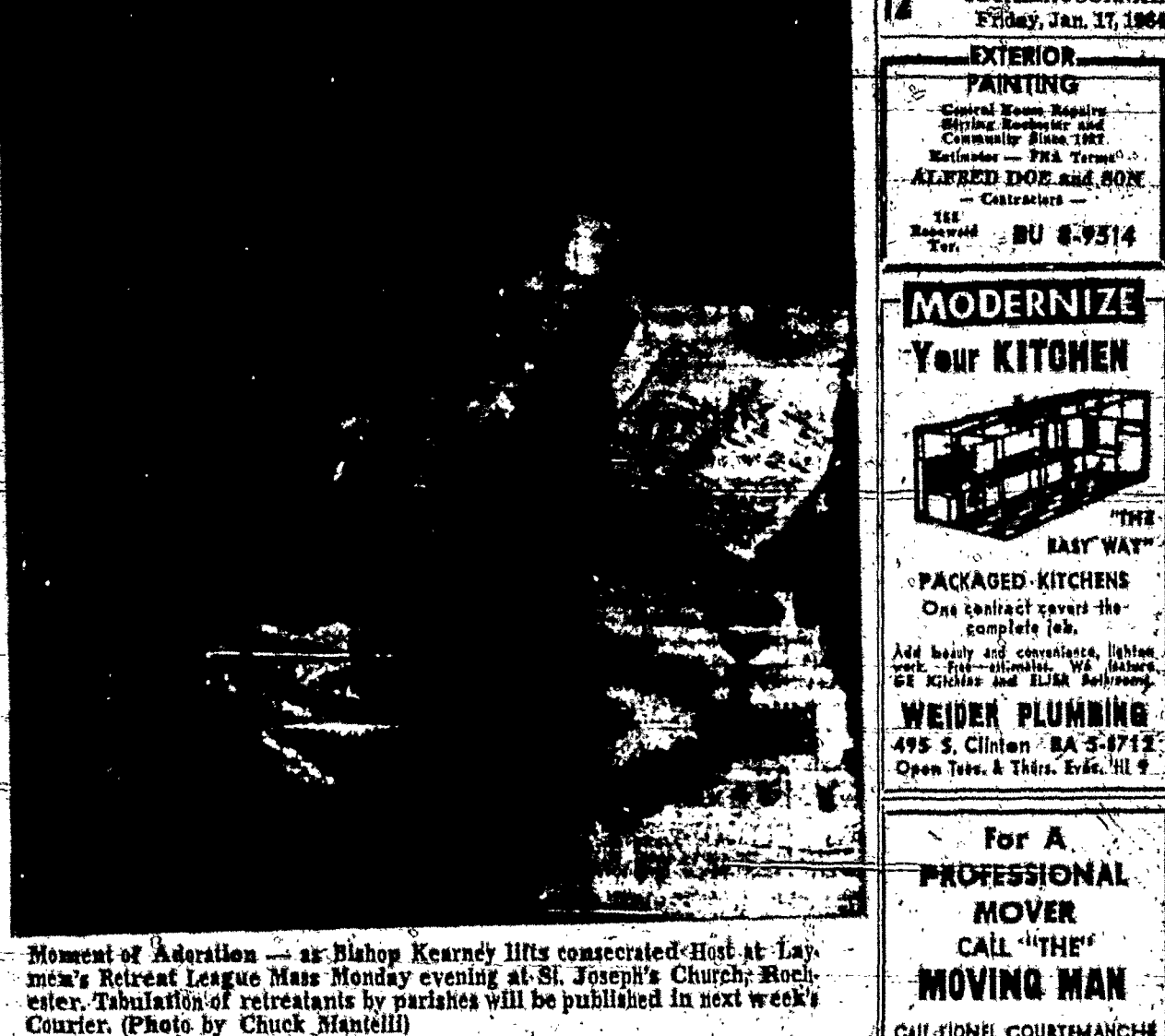
