Hostesses were: Mrs. Gal Smith, Mrs. Donald Bouchard and Mrs. Euclid St. Pierre.

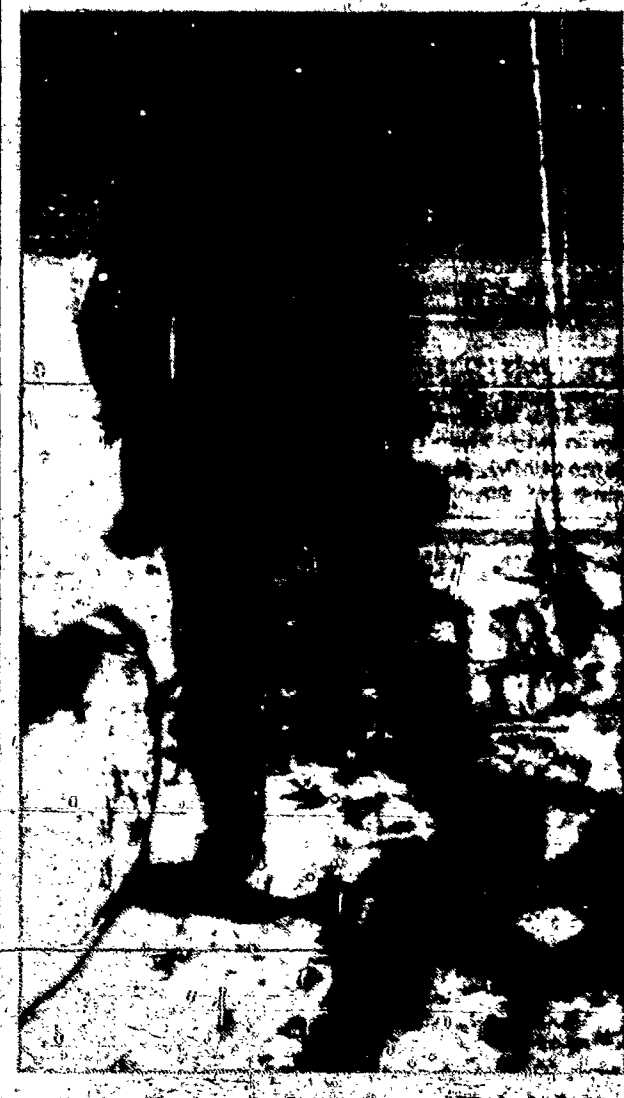
Their children, Trudy, Theresa and Phillip are seniors at Genesee State Teachers' College, St. Mary's Hospital, and Alfred University, respectively.
