

Annual Mass For Newsmen

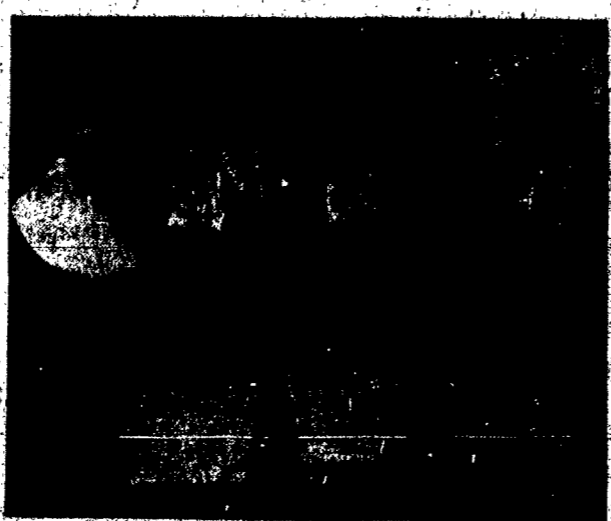

Visual Teaching Aids Awarded To Nazareth

Presentation of a \$3,000 grant of visual teaching equipment from the 3-M Company was made this week to Nazareth Academy at a special assembly of administrators, teachers and students.

Making the award on behalf of the 3-M Co. were: S. J. Houghton and R. W. Brooks of Business Methods Inc., local agency. Accepting the award were Sister M. Jamesita, principal of the academy, and the Rev. Daniel Brent, associate superintendent of Catholic Schools.

NAZARETH ACADEMY was one of three local schools to receive this award. Other winners were Brookport High School, and Winslow Elementary School of Rush Henrietta.

Prior to submission to this national committee, proposals were screened by local committees of educators in each of 200 major cities. The local selection committee consisted of: Dr. William Fulliger, dean of the College of Education, University of Rochester; Dr. Maurice Kessman, director of Educational Research, Rochester Institute of Technology; Mr. Lester Forman, superintendent, Monroe County District No. 1; Rev. Daniel Brent, associate superintendent of Rochester Catholic Schools.

The awards consisted of a \$3,000 model visual communications system including 11 classroom overhead projectors, two transparency makers and transparency film and copy paper. This system enables teachers to produce transparencies from a variety of source materials such as newspaper articles, textbooks, materials, student homework or class assignments. These transparencies projected before the class enable teachers to present new facts and ideas clearly and dramatically.

In her proposal, Sister M. Jamesita suggested possibilities for adequate research patterns among the students. Sister said Nazareth "is already engaged in a well-established audio-visual program which includes the use of overhead projectors."

In a letter to the principal Bert S. Cross, president of 3-M Co., stated: "Your comprehensive and professional proposal has greatly impressed all of us and has reinforced the faith and confidence that we have long held in the teachers of America."

Aquinas Athletics Head Gives Vocations Talk

In a talk on Vocations to the Religious Life, the Rev. Cyril F. Carter, C.S.B., pointed out to a large group of parents at Nazareth Hall Cadet School that the requirements of religious life are parallel to those of an athlete.

"Just as an athlete needs good health, average intelligence, strong hands and a great love of the game," said Father Carter who is Director of Athletics at Aquinas Institute. "The dedicated religious must have these 4 H's — Health, Head, Hands and Heart."

THE CHURCH TODAY is in desperate need of personnel to carry the message of Christ around the world. Father pointed out that boys and girls should use the 4 H's in evaluating themselves as possible religious. Most religious must have normally good health, be able to obtain a college degree, have a desire to use their talents in the service of God, and experience a great love for all men; created in His likeness.

"The vocation of St. Paul was unique," continued Father Carter, "inasmuch as he received the Divine Call in a blinding flash of lightning. No such thing occurs in the call of Christ today. A young man or woman who feels the slightest desire for a dedicated life should pray much, frequent Mass and the Sacraments often, even daily and examine his abilities against
