Working for a prize offered by Bishop Kearney, 15,000 school children of this diocese were engaged in the Golden Jubilee Crusade for Catholic Courier subscriptions. Simple ceremonies marked the funeral of Reverend Mother Beatrix of the Holy Spirit, O.S.B., Carmelite Sister in the world. Bishop Kearney offered the Requiem Mass at the old Carmelite Monastery, 1530 East Ave. Foundress of the Rochester Carmel, Mother Beatrix died Jan. 28, 1939.

Carmelite Prior Speaks To Apalachin Rosarians

Apalachin - Father Bruno Cocuzzi, O.S.B., Prior of Our Lady's Hill Monastery in Waverly, was guest speaker at the January meeting of the Rosary Society of St. Margaret Mary's Church in Apalachin. Father Bruno spoke on the meaning of the Ecumenical Council in relation to changing times and what this means to today's Catholic. PLANS ARE also being made to hold the Rosary Society's annual Card Party on April 10th. Chairman and arrangements for the affair will be announced at a later date. A discussion was held concerning the Apalachin Society's participation in the Diocesan Catholic Council of Women. Under this Council, the Rosary Society of Apalachin, will begin work with Foreign Aid, Spiritual Development and Parent Education. Foreign Aid work will consist of making hospital gowns out of old white shirts and handkerchiefs out of white sheeting. Under Spiritual Development, a Retreat for parish women is being set up for the near future. Parent Education will involve a Rosarian contacting a Catholic mother when a new child is born. Leaflets will be given the mother and information regarding ideas on how to raise the child with God's image before him. This will enable the child to have an image of God by the time they reach the age of three. Following the plans of the DCCW, the mother and child will be contacted every six months.
