

Mooney High Top Auburn Face Geneva

Cardinal Mooney came from behind to defeat Mt. Carmel 24-14 Friday, Jan. 24, in a new school playing record of 22 points per single game.

Mooney jumped off to an impressive 12-1 start, but by the end of the first quarter Mooney had lost the gap and trailed by 7 points, the score 12-19.

In the second quarter Mt. Carmel outscored the Cardinals 12-8 and led 24-14 going into the third quarter.

During the third quarter Mooney's full court press began to make the difference as the Mt. Carmel 4 started to tire. Mooney was ahead 34-34 as the final period began. The Cardinals were never again in trouble as they poured in 22 points during the final 8 minutes of play to win 56-34.

Four men hit double figures led by Terry Murphy who set a new individual school scoring record of 35 points. Tim Kelly scored 15, James Werth and Ole Davis, 11 points apiece.

Aquinas Bids For Basketball Sweep

Aquinas Institute is a good bet to complete a sweep of a big basketball weekend when the Irish host Mount Carmel of Auburn tonight and Benjamin Franklin High tomorrow.

Game time at the Dewey Avenue hardwood is set for 8:15 both nights with a winter variety program at 6:30 p.m.

The Irish will enter tonight's game after a two week breather for mid-term examinations. Aquinas stand 2-3 over-all and is currently riding a six game win streak.

Rev. Cyril F. Carter, C.S.S., Aquinas athletic director, attributes the school's basketball success this season to young Jack Kelly, who bounced-out of Assumption University to take over as head coach. The secret to his success, according to Father Carter, is determination, spirit and teamwork. Kelly has combined all three at Aquinas and out of it has dribbled a well-drilled team that can rebound, fast break, shoot from the outside or inside and play defense with the best of them.

Kelly's well-balanced club is made up of boys who can handle text books as well as they handle the basketball. Six-foot-six Tom Peterius, an honor student, has been averaging 17 points a game and is practically unstoppable under the hoop. Jim Caverly is a game-long star with his rebounding, passing and shooting. Frank Wosnick and Jim Cato are great in the backcourt while Dominic Bozzelli and Steve Herbert are highly effective with their shooting and rebounding. Great defensive play is credited to football star Kevin Barrett at 4-8, the shortest man on the team and one of the most aggressive. Dave Mancuso, a hefty 5-10 junior, is also expected to see action.
