Solemn Requiem For Miss Sweeney
Funeral Mass for Miss Catherine A. Sweeney was offered in St. Monica Church, Wednesday, Jan. 29. Miss Sweeney, 64, a telephone operator in Rochester 35 years, died Jan. 27, 1944. The Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by Rev. Thomas C. Kane with Rt. Rev. Msgr. Gerald C. Lambert, deacon and Rev. Gerald E. Dunn, subdeacon.

Mr. Lamb, 71, who held the K. of C. office since 1938, died in St. Elizabeth's Hospital, New York City, Feb. 3, 1944. During his term in the national post and before that at State Deputy and district deputy he had visited councils in the Diocese of Rochester often and attended many state conventions here. He was highly esteemed by members of the order in the diocese.


A DELEGATION of area Knights of Columbus headed by Raymond L. Nary, master of Fifth District, Fourth Degree, Knights of Columbus attended.

A native of New York, Mr. Lamb was an alumnus of Fordham and Columbia universities and a World War I Army officer. In 1942, Mr. Lamb was made a knight commander of the Order of St. Gregory the Great by Pope Pius XII; in 1946 he was elevated to the rank of grand officer. Spain awarded him the San Raimundo de Penafort Cross of the First Class in 1935.
