Golden Jubilees At Mercy

Sister Mary Anselm, a former principal of Old St. Mary's School, Rochester, and Sister Mary Francesca, foundress and long-time principal of Our Lady of Mercy High School, will celebrate their golden jubilees as members of Mercy today, Feb. 7, at Our Lady of Mercy Motherhouse.

A well known educator of many and varied talents, Sister Francesca has had a wide experience in teaching and administration during her 45 years of service in schools of this Diocese from 1912 to 1957. An artist, a teacher of mathematics and apologetics, a guidance director, a popular public speaker, an administrator on both the elementary and secondary school levels, Sister Francesca has left her mark on the educational picture of this diocese.

She was the first principal of St. Charles Borromeo School, Greece, when it opened in 1926. She likewise served as principal in St. Cecilia School, Elmira, and Saint Patrick School, Owego. Her first teaching assignment was at Saint Mary's School, Corning.

SISTER FRANCESCA is a graduate of the Rochester Institute of Technology. She received her B.A. and M.A. degrees from Canisius College, Buffalo, and did further graduate work at Catholic University in the field of educational administration. She was principal of Mercy High School for 22 years.

From 1955 to 1961 she was a member of the governing council of the Sisters of Mercy. She has been in semi-retirement due to illness for the past few years, but retains several important responsibilities including the community's Apostolate of Mercy program, the motherhouse library, correspondence promoting the beatification of Mother McAuley, and the making of linen tickle sets for the administration of the Sacraments in the home.

Sister Mary Anselm will likewise be feted by her community today, Feb. 7, in honor of her golden jubilee as a professed Sister of Mercy, despite her serious illness in the motherhouse infirmary.

SISTER ANSELM entered the order in June, 1911, from Union Springs, N.Y. She is a graduate of Nazareth College and of St. Bonaventure University. She taught every grade of elementary school during the 47 years she served in ten different schools of the Diocese. From 1947-1950 she acted as principal of Old St. Mary's School, Rochester. Her last two assignments were at St. Andrew's and St. Charles Borromeo Schools.

Sister Anselm retired to the motherhouse in 1961. She has been confined to her bed for the past year.

The Rev. Gerald T. Corbett, Sister Mary Francesca's nephew, will celebrate the Golden Jubilee Mass. Sister Mary Majella will direct the Sisters' choir.
