Mass in Home Adds Chapter To Saga of Cage Stars

The friendship epic of Maurice Stokes and Jack Twyman, nationally known basketball stars, who played in Rochester some years ago, had another chapter added according to an account from Cincinnati this week. Stokes, stricken six years ago with a crippling disease, attended his first Mass as a Catholic (Dec. 30) and Twyman, who has remained his friend in need served as acolyte.

Stokes was paralyzed six years ago when he collapsed aboard a plane carrying the Cincinnati Royals basketball squad from Detroit to Cincinnati. MEANWHILE, Father John Campbell, former principal of De Porter High School, began visiting Stokes at the hospital to give him formal instruction in the Catholic Faith. He had Mrs. Stokes when the big man had come to De Porter to speak to the students. Stokes had been receiving

Communion weekly at the hospital for some weeks. He did so at his first Mass. When Father Niklas received permission for the Mass, Mr. Henry J. Vorobek, the Chancellor, wrote a postscript which said: "Get Twyman to serve."

Stokes was wheeled from his bed at Ohio Hospital, where he has spent the past six years battling paralysis, to a nearby sanatorium, Thera. Father Gerald Niklas of Holy Name Church had set up a temporary altar and offered the Mass.
