Folk music continues to split its ever-widening web to capture the hearts of young and old alike.

Incorporating such diverse talents as a gospel-oriented Arkansas baritone and a booming contralto, the group can now be heard on a new deluxe two record Decca release.

Included are Goodnight Irene and Tzena. These two songs are skyrocketed The Weavers to national attention in the early '50's.

The flawless performance by The Weavers also includes The Roving Kind, Kisses Sweeter Than Wine, Wimoweh, Rock Island Line, On Top of Old Smokey and So Long (It's Been Good to Know You).

Hearing these songs for the first time in many years and hearing them for the first time in stereo, both contribute to the immense enjoyment the two record album will bring for years to come.

The unique styling and pleasing voices of The Weavers are a welcome addition to any record collection. And this couplet with the fine selection of songs in this album make it a treasure trove that will be played and replayed by every member of your family.

Other numbers in the album are Old Paint, Sylvie, Bay of Mexico, (The Wreck of the John B.), Midnight Special.

Acclaims Jewish Play By Friars

(Rochester's Blackfriars presented Arnold Forster's "The World of Sholom Aleichem" on Feb. 14, 15 and 16 in Nazareth College auditorium.

The superb total melodic effect couldn't be better. It is a true feast for the ears that will take its proud place among the great recordings of all time.

Two of Brenda Lee's biggest single record hits are featured in her new Decca album, Let Me Sing. The album title was well chosen because singing is evidently her first love.

Included are There Goes My Heart, Night and Day, You're the Reason I'm Living, At Last, Out in the Cold Again and five others. Pleasant and impressive from beginning to end.

Rick Nelson sings for you on a new release by Decca. Along with the title song, he has also included his smash hit single of Fools Rush In. His pleasing voice and distinctive style are the assurance for many happy hours of listening pleasure.

A chorus joins Rick for many of the numbers to add an impressive assist to some incredibly damnable music. Other numbers included are That Some Old Feeling, This is All She Wrote, A Legend in My Time, The Neanness of You, Hello Mr. Happiness and five others.
