Spaghetti Supper In Seneca Falls

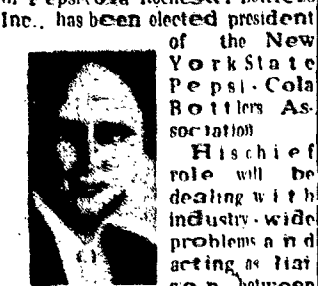

U. of R. Newmanite Review 'God On Secular Campus'

"There are two Catholics in secular colleges today, for each one in a Catholic college. These figures underline the growing importance of the Newman Club apostolate," said reviewer Michael Meagher, in his critique of "God on the Secular Campus."

The book was authored by Rev. Raymond Butler, a Newman Club chaplain of many years at the University of New Mexico.

IN CONTRAST to the early years of American higher education, when all the colleges were church-related, the great majority of these institutions today are non-denominational. Religion is either omitted from the curriculum completely, or relegated to a back seat with a few comparative religions courses.

"In such an atmosphere, the Newman Club chaplain must indeed be all things to all men," noted the reviewer, a senior Biology major at the University of Rochester.

"Besides his normal priestly functions, and a lot of pastoral counseling, he must, hopefully, be an intellectual man, who can command the respect of his colleagues in the academic world he lives in," he explained.

Father Butler discusses the many difficulties that a Catholic student faces in such an environment. His comments on the classroom arena were elucidated further by Mr. Meagher.

"If a professor ridicules religion in class, it's no place to fight back. The teacher is already

Contest On JFK Address To Highlight Latin Exhibit

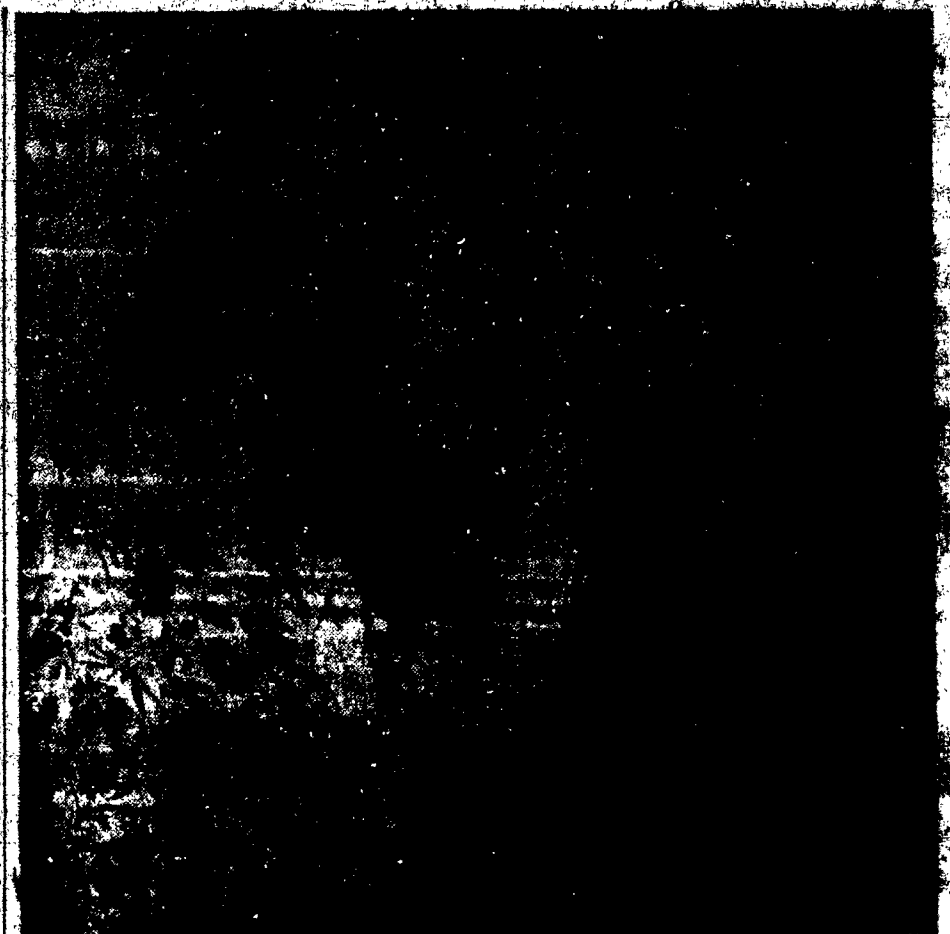

Mass in Home Adds Chapter To Saga of Cage Stars

The friendship epic of Maurice Stokes and Jack Twyman, nationally known basketball stars, who played in Rochester some years ago, had another chapter added according to an account from Cincinnati this week.

Father Niklas' duties include visiting Catholic patients at the Methodist-affiliated hospital. He and Stokes have become close friends. The priest obtained special permission from the archdiocesan chancery to hear Mass for Stokes, whose struggle against the crippling effects of encephalitis have won him as much fame as his All-American basketball career.

Equally famous is Twyman's friendship, which aided Stokes' conversion to the Catholic Faith. Like Twyman, who starred at the University of Cincinnati before joining the Royals, Stokes was battling paralysis, to ails from Pittsburgh. He attended St. Francis College at Loreto, Pa., where he first became interested in the Church.

ON TRIP WITH the Royals the Negro star often accompanied Twyman and Richie Regan, another Catholic teammate, to Mass on Sundays and holy days. It was Regan, now coach at Seton Hall University, N.J., who baptized Stokes on the plane, but it was Twyman, now a Cincinnati resident and still with the Royals, who took over the management of Stokes' affairs and began a whirlwind nationwide campaign to raise money for Stokes' enormous medical expenses.

MEANWHILE, Father John Campbell, former principal of De Forest High School, began visiting Stokes at the hospital to give him formal instructions in the Catholic Faith. He had met Stokes when the big pro had come to De Forest to speak to the students.

Stokes had been receiving Communion weekly at the hospital for some weeks. He did so at his first Mass.

When Father Niklas received permission for the Mass, Fr. Henry J. Vogelstein, the Chancellor, wrote a postscript which said: "Get Twyman to serve."
