

# Aquinas Closes With 13-5 Mark

Aquinas Institute closed out its regular basketball schedule last weekend with a pair of convincing wins. Next in sight is the Catholic Diocesan Basketball Tournament and a semi-final round clash on March 7 with McQuaid Jesuit High-School.

Last Friday the Irish traveled to La Roy and scored a 64-47 victory over LeRoy Central School.

Big Keegan provided the second period lift that enabled the Jack Kelly-coached Irish to beat their 66-55 intrastate rival.

In the preliminary game the Aquinas juniors built a 24-point intrastate margin and coasted to a 76-43 victory over the Le Roy jays. John LeVeck was high for Aquinas with 17 markers.

Last Saturday the Aquinas variety exploded for 12 straight points midway in the second period and walked away from St. Michael's of Toronto, 64-49, before a jam-packed Aquinas gym.

It was Aquinas' game all the way, the winners straggling off some (seen resistance from St. Mike's early in the game before waiting off with the victory and handing the visitors their second defeat at the hands of Aquinas this year. Earlier this season Aquinas broke the century mark by defeating St. Michael's, 107-48, in Toronto.

St. Mike's never led in the one-sided contest as the Irish jumped off to a 19-7 lead after the first period. Big Tom Petorius had 13 points at the half, 10 rebounds and had the arrow in an attempt with his shot, blocking, dunk, shooting and administering rebounding on both ends.

The Irish strayed off their prolific scoring pace in the third quarter but still outscored St. Mike's 18-11. In the last period, Aquinas scored 23 points to the visitors' 17.

At season's end, Aquinas posted statistics show Tom Petorius high for 17 games with 256 points for a 15.1 point per game average. Jim Caverly garnered 198 points in 16 games for a 12.4 average.

Aquinas concluded the season with a 13 win, 5 lost record.

# Record-Breaking 13 For McQuaid Knights

McQuaid Jesuit High's thirteenth court win of the season saw the Knights break their single-game scoring record in a 66-55 romp over Mt. Carmel of Auburn at the McQuaid court last Saturday.

A short jump shot by John Stanley in the game's final minute topped the previous McQuaid high of 62 points, established in December against Jefferson. Stanley was one of five Knights in double figures, his 12 points going along with Tony Leonard's 19, Sam Inarcone's 10, Bob Brady's 16, and Lance Compa's 12.

McQuaid, now 13-4, concludes its regular season schedule on Friday at Franklin, then moves into the diocesan tournament against Aquinas at the War Memorial on March 7.

Mt. Carmel played close on the Knights' heels through most of last week's opening quarter, trailing by only 17-13 before a basket by Compa and a straight foul conversion by Leonard opened the gap to 11 points. The Mountaineers were in personal foul trouble early in the encounter, a factor that not only hurt their own game but also led to a 30-for-39 McQuaid foul-shooting bonanza.

Ken Jones' Knights had a 42 per cent shooting night from the field and were over 50 per cent in the second half with a largely untroubled lineup.

For the losers, Tom Dolan's 17 points and Roger Beer's 15 took scoring honors.

McQuaid's freshman and JV teams also scored against Mt. Carmel invaders. The frosh had to come from 11 points back in the last period but managed to squeak through, 50-48, with Henry Enders netting 19 points. The JV's had it much easier, coasting in by 75-56 with Tom Gibson's 15 points leading a widely spread attack.
