

# Notre Dame Grads Hear ND Coach 'Moose' Krause

Edward W. ("Moose") Krause, director of athletics at the University of Notre Dame described plans for a new Athletic and Convocation Center on the campus at a dinner meeting of the school's alumni, parents and friends at the Rochester Club on March 4 at 7:30 p.m.

Krause is chairman of a \$5 million campaign for the new facility which will have twin areas, one with a capacity of 10,500 for basketball, convocations and special events. The building will also provide facilities for a variety of intercollegiate athletics and intramural sports as well as a skating rink and headquarters for the athletic department.

The proposed Center is one of four major objectives of Challenge II, a comprehensive three-year, \$20 million Notre Dame development program. During the evening Krause showed a sound filmstrip, "Challenge II for Notre Dame."

John Casey and Jack Heagney were co-chairmen.

Krause first came to Notre Dame as a student in 1930, and has been associated with its department of athletics as a coach or executive since 1942. He was a first-string tackle for the "Fighting Irish" in 1931-32, and during these same years was an All-American in basketball, setting Notre Dame scoring records for a single game, single season and three seasons. He was graduated from the University in 1934.
