

Msgr. Curtin Memorial Set In Clyde

Clyde — The third anniversary of the death of Monsignor Joseph V. Curtin will be celebrated on Sunday, March 10, at the 10:30 a. m. Mass. Monsignor Curtin served the Clyde and Savannah parishes for thirty-two years, and was well known in Wayne County area both for his work as a churchman and as a civic leader.

He was one of the prime leaders instrumental in bringing the Acme company to Clyde, which later became a branch of General Electric, Clyde's main industry.

Invitations to the Mass have been sent to relatives and friends of the late prelate and to the Sisters of Mercy who served in Clyde during his pastorate. A breakfast for out-of-town guests will be served, followed by a tour of the new convent addition, and the "Msgr. J. V. Curtin Memorial" which is the new convent community room.

Father John Dillon, a nephew of Monsignor Curtin, will celebrate the Mass, assisted by Father William Doran and the present pastor, Father Paul J. Cuddy. Father Joseph Gaynor will deliver the sermon. St. John's Adult Choir will sing a contrapuntal Mass, "Exultate Terra" by Von Hille, preceded by organ prelude by Mrs. Bruce Norton.
