

Legion Of Decency

Looking For Love
Objection: The treatment of this film, which has been made especially for young people, exploits suggestiveness in costuming and dialogue.

Class C
Silence
Objection: The theme of this film, as formulated by its director, is "God's silence—the negative print." Being the last of a trilogy and interpreted against this over-all context, the film presents the nightmare of a world left to itself in which the human spirit must succumb. It cannot find or refuse to accept a meaning to life which transcends matter and the flesh.

Although the serious intent of Bergman may be beyond doubt, nevertheless, serious questions are to be raised concerning the treatment of his theme.

His selection of images is sometimes vulgar, insulting to a mature audience, and dangerously close to pornography.

In spite of the author's good intentions, therefore, he has seriously violated artistic taste and sensitivity and leaves the film's presentation open to sensational exploitation by the irresponsible.

Organ Recital At St. Jerome's

Aquinas Band Has World Fair Theme

In mid-March a Rochester audience will have a chance to hear music played by one of the state's top schoolboy bands, and at the same time get a look at the highlights of the forthcoming New York World's Fair. The occasion is the annual Spring Concert of the Aquinas Institute Band to be held on March 20 at 8:15 p.m. in the school auditorium.

The young musicians, winners of the New York State Band Championship last August, have been selected to represent Monroe County at the World's Fair on May 16 and 17. To highlight their trip to New York City, the band members have chosen as their concert theme, "Prelude to the Fair."

A unique program, arranged by Rev. Cyril R. Udall, C.S.B., director of the Aquinas music department, will feature a combination of color slides depicting various Fair buildings and musical selections relating to the pictures.

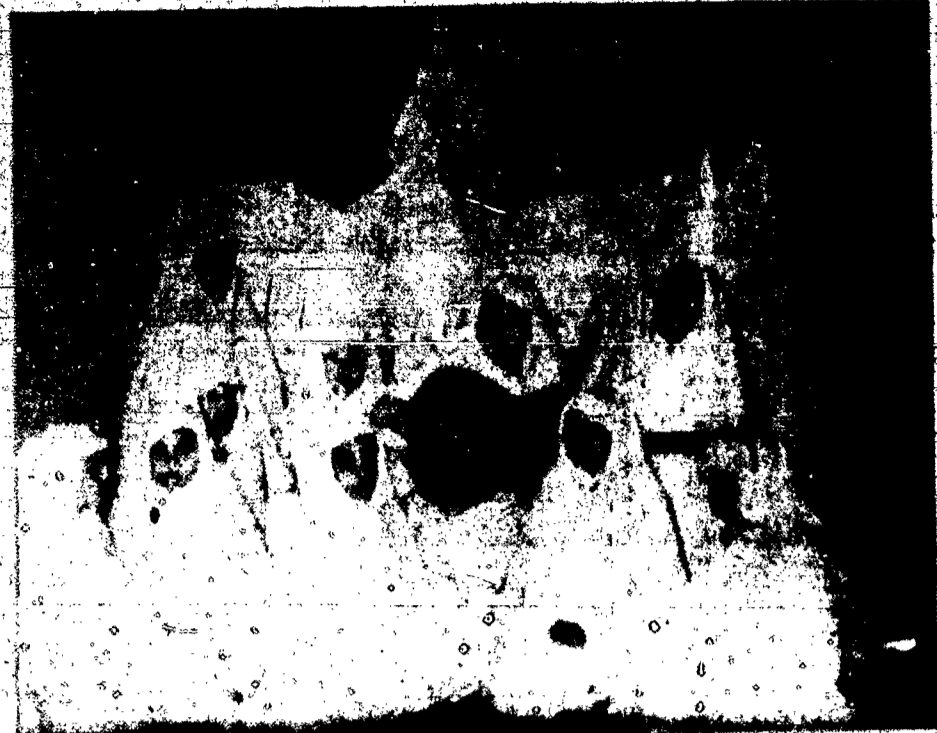
The 70-piece concert band, conducted by Father Udall, will present musical offerings ranging from a symphonic suite to popular show tunes. Also included will be several marches, many arranged by Father Udall.

Featured soloists will be Bernard Dick, clarinetist, in the Rondo from Clarinet Concerto by Mozart, and trombonist Michael Weisenborn in Come Back to Sorrento.

Other selections will include the Finale of Tchaikovsky's 4th Symphony and Walter's American Folk Song Suite.

On Saturday, March 21, the Aquinas band will present a program aimed at the teen age set. It will concentrate principally on popular styles in music played by a number of combos. Setting for the concert will be the gymnasium, transformed into a night club atmosphere with small tables arranged about the floor. Refreshments will be available.

All seats for both performances are unreserved. Tickets may be purchased at the door.



Greece Parish Girl Scouts Active

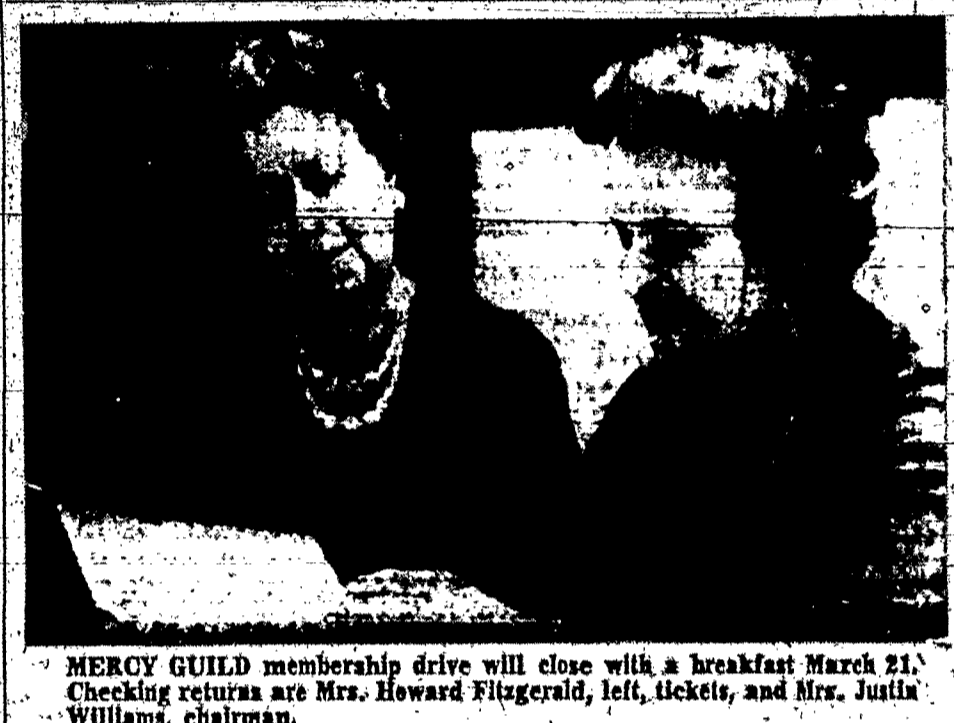

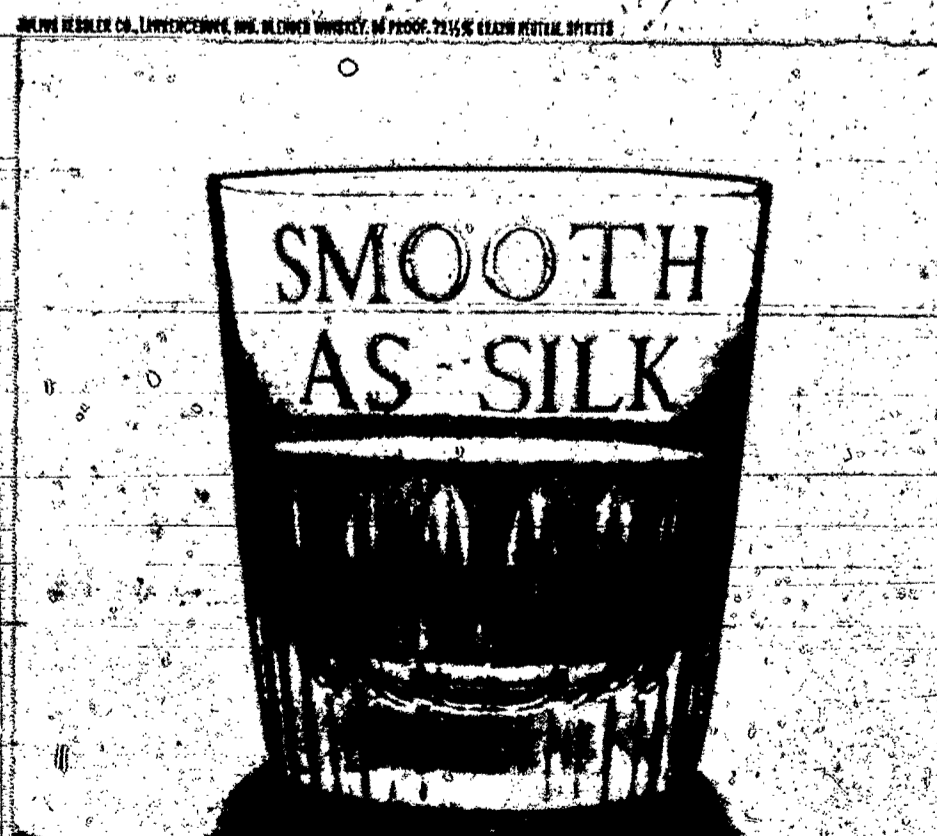
