Friends Honor Anthony Felice In Geneva

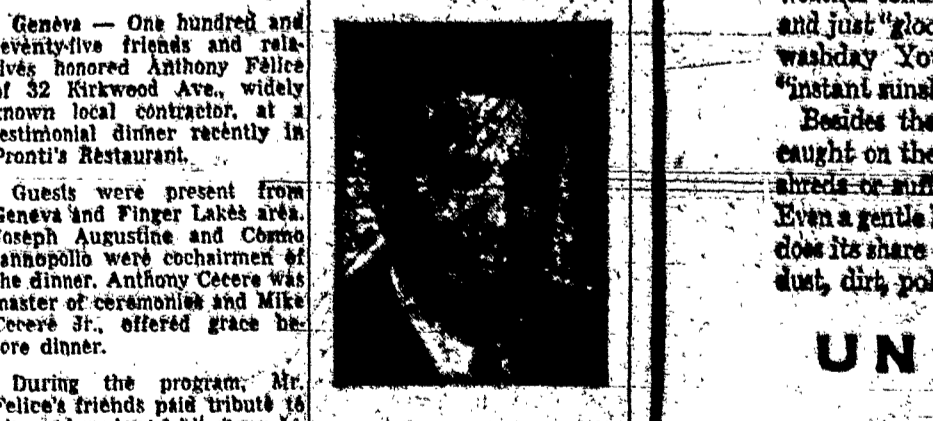
