

## All Christians Share Duty of Apostles

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope Paul VI, addressing pilgrims from many countries at his midweek general audience in the Vatican Palace's Hall of Benediction, stressed that all Catholics have an obligation to live in the Church's apostolic mission through Christian witness and charity.

"The apostolate in its highest form," he said, "is that of the Pope and the bishops, and in union with them of priests, religious and missionaries, but there is also an apostolic obligation resting on every Christian who is truly faithful."

"The apostolate, even if unofficial or unorganized, is the concern of all true followers of Christ. The proof of this is very simple. One cannot be a true Christian without charity, and charity cannot exist without loving one's fellow human beings, one's brothers, other people."

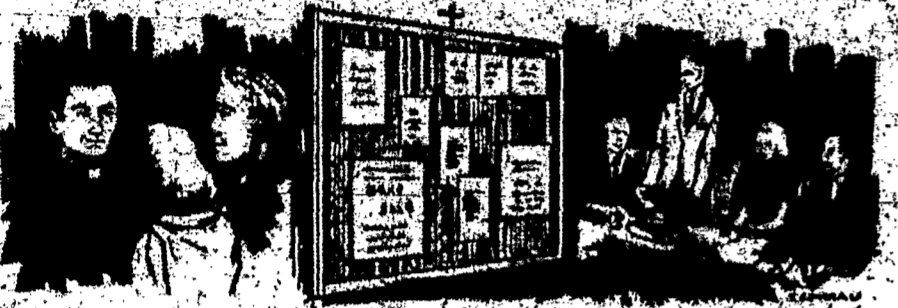
Speaking in Italian, Pope Paul said "We would like your audience with the Pope to stir in each of your souls a sense of the apostolate in a way corresponding to your own particular condition of life."

"Each can and must," he said, "give Christian witness and bring comfort to his neighbor by his loyalty to Christ. The Christian indifferent to the well-being of others is not to be thought of as a true Christian. An egotistical Christian is a contradiction in terms."

## Missioners Battle Illiteracy in Africa

Nyegus — (RNS) — Two U.S. missionaries in Tanganyika have taught the rudiments of reading and writing to about 200 members of the Bakwaya tribe by combining instruction for literacy with catechism lessons.

Fathers Thomas McGovern, M.M., of Jersey City, and James Roy of Winslow, Maine, purchased literacy kits and distributed them to their religion-illiterate students. After explaining the story of salvation, the missionaries sit down with the men and women to labor through the alphabet. Progress is necessarily slow because for many this is the first time that they have owned a book of their own.

"The people want very much to learn to read and write," Father McGovern said, "but on their own, even with the heartiest encouragement from the civil administrators, it is difficult. Lacking qualified teachers and good books, the people soon lose heart. By combining religious and secular education—the people regardless of the difficulties want religion—we have been able to make a small but real contribution to the country."

But teaching reading and writing is not enough if the people do not develop a habit of reading. Father McGovern explained. Therefore, the two priests have opened a reading room and library here. Eight shelves of books, in Swahili and English, line the room with subjects of interest for every taste and education.

The school teachers can choose Chekhov's plays, Shakespeare, Mark Twain, Joseph Conrad and Plutarch's Lives. Simplified versions of the classics like "Robinson Crusoe" in Swahili are available for the school children. Anyone interested in opening a small business can borrow the English-Swahili handbooks "Keeping Shop" and "Using Accounts."
