## Miter Replaces Chains

Saligon (NO) — A weather-worn, kindly faced man who once wore iron shackles in a communist prison received the mitre, cope and crozier of an abbot here. He was one of three who received consecration in Saigon cathedral as the first Vietnamese abbots. Their monasteries, all Cistercian of the common observance, now become abbeys.

Abbot Tuyen spent 22 months as a prisoner of the communist Vietnam, as they were then known, in northeastern Vietnam. During part of that time he was shackled hand and foot. When he was released, he was a long-bearded, long-haired, half-clad, emaciated man.

Abbot Stanislaus Trung dinh Yang, S.O.Cist., 53, heads the monastery in Phuoc Ly, not far from Saigon. It was founded in 1950.

Youngest of the three is Abbot Stephen Tran ngoc Hoang, S.O.Cist., 36, whose monastery is near Dait.

The consecration was performed by the Abbot General of the Cistercians of the common observance, Abbot Sighard Kienner, S.O.Cist., who has been in Vietnam since mid-February.

Archbishop Paul Nguyen van Binh of Saigon presided in the sanctuary. Six other bishops of Vietnam were present as well as Msgr. Francesco De Nittis, charge d'affaires of the apostolic delegation. The cathedral was crowded for the ceremony.

Among those present were 10 seminarians in the uniform of officers' candidates. They are among more than 100 Catholic seminarians required to serve in the Vietnamese armed forces.

### Two Bishops For Havana

Vatican City — (NC) — Two new auxiliary bishops have been appointed for the Havana, Cuba, archdiocese by Pope Paul VI. They are Father Ferdinando Azcarate, S.J., and Msgr. Alfredo Liaguno Canals, who is currently the vicar general of the archdiocese.

## Yugoslav Defender Of Faith Dies at 84


Belgrade — (RNS) — Archbishop Josip Ujic of Belgrade, long known as a forthright champion of the rights of the Catholic Church in Communist Yugoslavia, died at his residence here at the age of 84 after a prolonged illness.

He had served as acting chairman of the Bishops' Conference since the imprisonment in 1946 of Alojzys Cardinal Stepinac, Archbishop of Zagreb, who died in 1960. He was relieved of his post at his own request because of illness and advanced age in 1961, when Pope John XXIII named Archbishop Franjo Sener, Cardinal Stepinac's successor in the Zagreb See, as chairman of the Conference.

Less than ten years after his being named archbishop in 1950, Archbishop Ujic, along with the rest of the Yugoslavian hierarchy, saw himself confronted by increasing anti-Church persecution as the new Communist government headed by Marshal Tito sought to eliminate all elements of potential opposition. With the arrest of Cardinal Stepinac, the chief responsibility of protecting the rights of the country's roughly six million Catholics fell upon his shoulders.

Archbishop Ujic died with his hope of a strong Church-State agreement unrealized, but his success as a negotiator, however partial.

### Council Talks In New Book

New York — (RNS) — Fifty-one of the major addresses made by bishops at the Second Vatican Council's second session last year have been published in a 288-page paperback book by the Paulist Press here.

Entitled "Council Speeches of Vatican II," the book was edited by three prominent Catholic theologians.

They were Father Hans Kueng, dean of the theological faculty at the University of Tuebingen, Germany, and author of "The Council, Reform and Reunion"; Father Yves Congar of Strasbourg, France, author of "Lay People in the Church"; and Father, Daniel O'Hanlon, theology professor at Alma College, Los Gatos, Calif., and an associate editor of America, national Catholic weekly.

U.S. bishops represented in the volume include: Bishop Ernest Primeau of Manchester, N.H., on "Responsible Freedoms of the Layman"; Auxiliary Bishop Stephen A. Leven of San Antonio, on "Dangers of Ecumenism?"; and Bishop Robert E. Tracy of Baton Rouge, on "No Racial Discrimination."

Among others are Augustin Cardinal Bea, S.J., head of the Vatican Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity, on "Catholics and Jews"; Bishop Emile Joseph De Smedt of Bruges, on "Religious Liberty"; Valerian Cardinal Gracis, Archbishop of Bombay, on "Not Domination But Service"; and Paul-Emile Cardinal Leger, Archbishop of Montreal, on "Freedom and Diversity."

### A Candle In The Soup

### Shared TV Ruled OK

Baltimore — (NC) — In what may be a precedent-setting opinion, the Maryland attorney general ruled that public school facilities may be used by parochial school pupils for secular education.

In his opinion, Thomas B. Finan declared that although there is no constitutional barrier to cooperation between public and parochial schools, special approval would have to come from the state legislature.

The ruling was in response to a request of a Catholic school in Hagerstown, Md., which sought to be included in the country's closed-circuit television network.
