**Meditation In Maryland**

Annapolis—(RNS)—A Maryland legislature bill requiring a moment of meditation in public schools won approval here, but only on "the" understanding teachers may not hold or read from Bibles during the period of silence.

"Silent meditation" as a substitute for open prayer barred by the U.S. Supreme Court won passage in the General Assembly. Gov. J. Millard Tawes had asked for an opinion on the bill's constitutionality in a memo to Thomas B. Finan, attorney general.

Finan held that that part of the bill permitting a teacher to hold a Bible as she directed her students to begin a "moment of meditation" was unconstitutional.

received these delegations as "real diplomatic envoys of a state."

The front-row maintains a permanent delegation in Prague, a communist capital from which contacts with other parts of Europe and with Africa are fairly easy.

On Jan. 31 an important delegation of the Vietnam Labor Party, which is the Communist party, arrived in Moscow. It had been invited by the Communist party of Soviet Russia. Headed by Le Duan, who holds the key position of first secretary of the Vietnam party's central committee, the delegation spent 14 days in Moscow.

On Feb. 8, the members had a long session with "Comrade N. S. Khrushchev," who gave a party for them on the same day. Soviet bigwigs such as Mikoyan, Brezhnev and others were present.

On the way to and from Moscow the North Vietnam communist delegation visited Peking. On their arrival back in Hanoi on Feb. 14, they were welcomed by Ho Chi Minh and other Vietnamese communist leaders at the airport.

Meanwhile the most important communist diplomat ever to come to South Vietnam had arrived in Saigon. He is the head of the Polish delegation in the International Commission for Supervision and Control. Only in such a capacity could any communist represent itself openly in South Vietnam.

The new Polish delegate, who holds the rank of ambassador, is M. R. Spasowski, who was formerly Polish ambassador in Washington and more recently one of the top men in the ministry of foreign affairs in Warsaw. Here he replaced a man who had not held any comparable positions. Ambassador Spasowski's arrival here in January emphasized the importance that "many governments" had
