## Buffalo Raceway Season To Open

Hamburg—Night harness racing has returned to Western New York with the opening today, April 9, of Buffalo Raceway.

Nearly 700 horses are stabled at the Erie County Fairgrounds, eager to compete for an estimated \$1,000,000 in purses. About one quarter of this total will be paid out in special events which annually attract America's top horses and drivers.

The big plant is ready for the early opening. Both grandstands and the clubhouse are heated. A new windbreak has been installed at the clubhouse entrance.

Fans soon will be able to see the races on closed circuit television. The installation should be complete by mid-April. Monitors in the clubhouse and grandstand mezzanine will carry each race.

## Dr. Strangelove

Some of the most memorable music has come to us via the movie industry during the past year. And this is only a partial list.

Have you ever tried to imagine what a movie would be like without the music in the background properly setting the tranquility, danger, excitement and all the other emotions? Without this music, a great picture would only be a fair, and a fair picture is just a picture.

Such is the case of a new album released by Colpix Records entitled "Dr. Strangelove and Other Great Movie Themes." The album offers music that varies in mood but is thoroughly enjoyable and impressive from beginning to end.

The theme from "Dr. Strangelove" is brilliantly offered by Laurie Johnson and his orchestra while Sol Kaplan and his orchestra present the melodious theme from "The Victors" by Special Dream.



Morris Stoloff and his orchestra take most of the hour with a total of four separate themes on the album. They play the impressive River Kwai March—Colonel Bogey, the melodious Moonlight from Paganini, Song Without End and From Here to Eternity.

Johnny Williams conducts the Columbia Pictures Studio Orchestra for the Diamond Head Theme and Lawrence of Arabia is charmingly offered by Maurice Jarre and orchestra.

Also included in this showcase of top-notch music are themes from Psyche 59, In the French Style, Barabbas, Damn the Defiant and The Interns. Impeccable taste and superb melody dominates throughout the album. Whether or not you've seen the movies, you'll love the music.

Composer, arranger, conductor Acquaviva makes his debut on Decca Records with The Exhilarating Sound of Acquaviva and His Orchestra. The remarkable conductor was one of the first to combine the "pop" sound with an orchestra of symphonic size. The resulting music is light, pleasing and highly impressive.

Whether you enjoy music for dancing or for listening, Acquaviva's unique artistry is the answer. And what a pleasure after a hard day of working or shopping to sit down and have this charming music relax you instantly.

Included in the fascinating album are Intermission, Green Valley, Open Your Eyes, Autumn Again, C'Est La Vie, A Fool Was I, One Look At You, I Found A Rainbow and five other wonderful songs. Acquaviva's exceptional skills are sure to please.

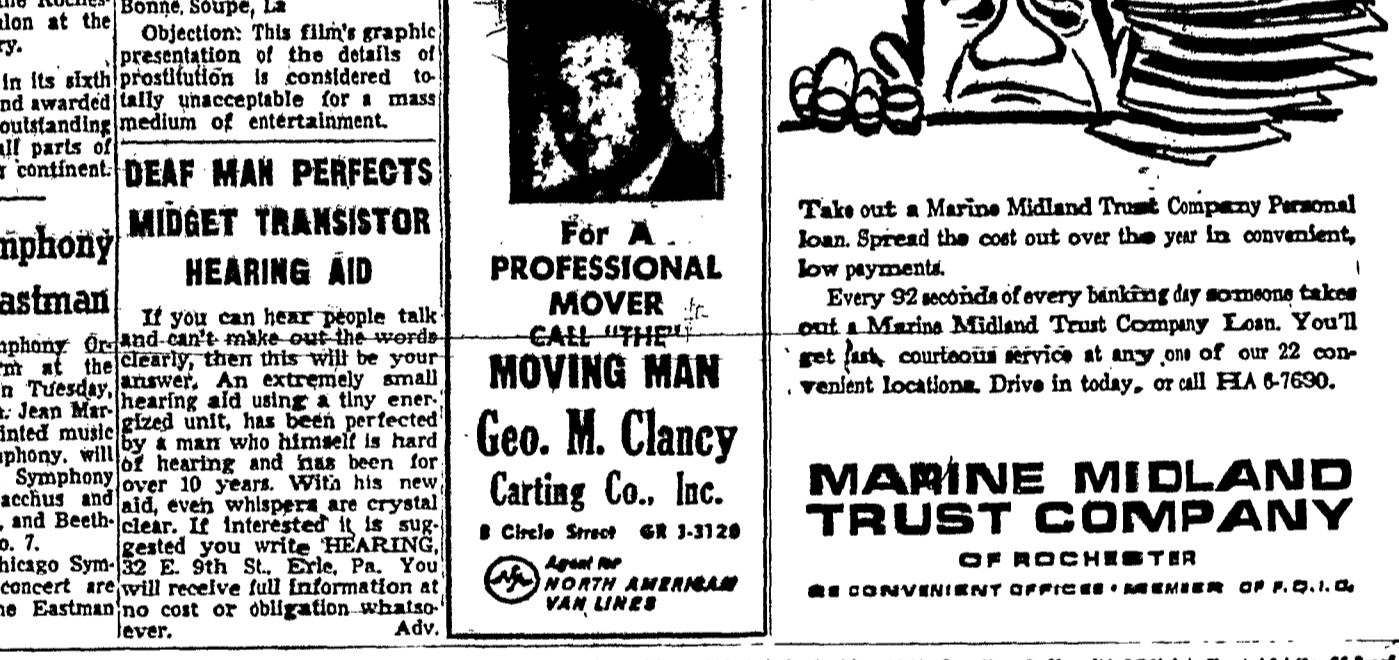
