Negro Martyrs Case Studied. Vatican City —(RNS)—The Sacred Congregation of Rites met to discuss the canonization cause of two young Negro converts who were martyred in Uganda in 1886 by order of a pagan chieftain, King Mwanga.

They were Carlo Luanga and Matthew Kambwa, who were put to death with great cruelty as were 20 of their companions. The entire group of 22 was beatified by Pope Benedict XV in 1920. Their ages ranged from 12 to 30, and most of them were pages in King Mwanga's court.

The canonization of the 22 martyred Blesseds was urged in 1961 by some 100 bishops in Africa. To date, only two of the causes have been taken up by the Congregation of Rites.

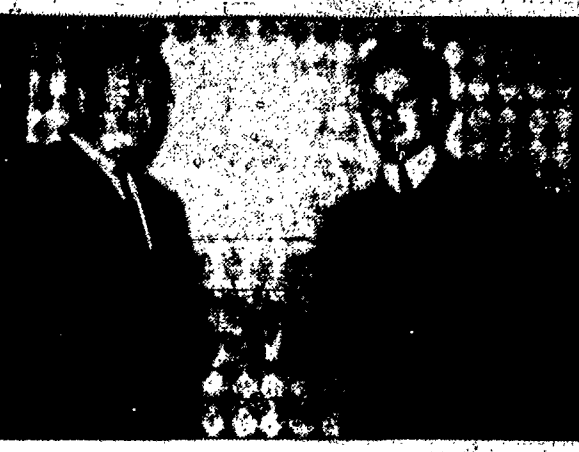
