Father Myschysyn was born in Detroit, Mich., on Nov. 26, 1913, the son of the late John and Sophia Prystacky Myschysyn. He has a wife, Mrs. Mary, and two children, Michael and John. He was baptized at St. John the Baptist Ukrainian Catholic Church in Detroit by the Rev. Eugene Bartosh, now retired and living in Waterville, N.Y.

During the German occupation he was assigned to Lubach as a teacher and catechist.

Following this he escaped to Warsaw and served there as Chaplain for the Benedictine Sisters.

He returned to United States in 1946 and was an assistant at Immaculate Conception Cathedral in Philadelphia. Later assignments were at Amherst, N.Y., Buffalo, Niagara Falls, and Stamford, Conn.

In September 1953 he was named pastor of St. Nicholas Ukrainian Catholic Church in Elmira Heights where he has additional duties to the beauty of that new church with the placement of the new iconostasis, stained glass windows, Stations of the Cross and the addition of a new rectory.
