Notre Dame Highlights

Mr. Arthur Abrams, owner of the Art Shop and artist in his own right, gave a demonstration to the Notre Dame Art Club at its last meeting in March.

With a pastel in hand, Mr. Abrams shaded the paper with an artist's air. He noted that in balancing a composition, a medium of red could equalize a larger portion of other colors.

Landscapes, the artist went on, are composed of three elements, the foreground, the middle distance and the background. Other features imperative to drawing are balance, movement and mass.

According to Mr. Abrams, one must think of massing items at the outset and then continue to depict detail. The owner of the Art Shop stated that man has borrowed from nature almost all his artistic forms: cylinder, pyramid and sphere, the three basic forms of nature.

At the completion of the demonstration, Mr. Abrams displayed an original and unique landscape, thus proving again that art is the masterwork of the hand.
