

## Shakespeare Record Issued At Nazareth

Two faculty members of the Nazareth College Music Department have issued a commemorative record as part of the college's Shakespeare Festival this week.

Sister Rose Alice, S.S.J., instructor in voice and theory, accompanied by Helen Koudof, assistant in piano, prepared a commemorative recording of four Shakespeare songs. The music is by contemporary composers and, according to Sister Rose Alice, "is happy evidence of renewed interest in the beauty and lyric quality of Shakespeare's texts."

THE SONGS are all taken from plays. "Orpheus with His Lute," the first selection, is found in King Henry VIII, Act III, Scene II. The music is by Ralph Vaughan Williams, one of the most important English composers of this century. The second, "Look, How the Floor of Heaven," is the only one of the four songs which does not actually appear as a song in the original play, but rather as dialogue. It is found in the Merchant of Venice, Act V, Scene I. The setting is by Ross Lee Finney, a contemporary American composer.

## Party Slated At Nazareth

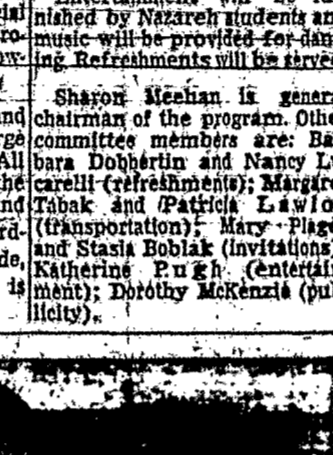
