Nazareth Nun Awarded Science Grant

An instructor in biology at Nazareth College has been awarded a 12-week National Science Foundation grant to do research work at Roswell Park Memorial Institute in Buffalo this summer.

SISTER MURIEL was one of three predoctoral applicants and three doctoral applicants chosen from 1,200 applicants.

The grant, which carries with it a \$400 stipend and travel allowance, will provide her with the opportunity to carry on her own research in the area of cell surfaces and tumor metastasis under the direction of Dr. Leonard Weiss, internationally known in the science field for his work at Strangeways Laboratory in Cambridge, England.

Sister Muriel received her B.A. degree from Syracuse University and her M.S. from the University of Pennsylvania. She also studied at St. Louis University and the University of Iowa.

She has spent three summers at Woods Hole Biological Laboratory in Massachusetts conducting research in cell division under the direction of Dr. L. V. Heilbrun, and has worked in the biological laboratories of Philadelphia General Hospital.

Last summer she was awarded a National Science Foundation grant operated by Cornell University for her research in cell surfaces.
