Camp Columbus Opens 31st Season At Owasco

Camp Columbus on Owasco Lake is preparing to open its 31st season on June 28.

A new brochure promoting the camp is being distributed throughout the diocese next week and applications for boys and girls are being accepted by contacting Rev. Gerald T. Connor, assistant pastor of St. Alphonsus Church and camp director.

The camp was founded in 1933 by the late St. Rev. Msgr. Frederick G. Straub and its facilities were available mostly to the boys and girls of St. Alphonsus parish.

However, the camp has grown in recent years and with accommodations for 110 campers all youngsters of the area are invited to make use of the facilities.

The first six weeks are for boys and the last three weeks are made available to the girls.

Although Camp Columbus is chiefly a "Waterfront Camp" it also has a variety of events. The daily program includes at least 30 projects to keep every youngster happy and busy.

Applications are accepted for boys from 7 years of age to the beginning of the 10th grade. 8th Graders are accepted for only the first two weeks.

Priests and seminarians supervised the boys while priests and college students are in charge during the girls' encampment.

Youngsters not of the Catholic faith are welcome and are not obliged to follow the religious program.
