


Religion at The World's Fair



Unisphere by U.S. Steel is theme center of N.Y. Fair.


Religion is on display at the New York World's Fair — and visitors are taking a good look at it.

One of the Fair's major attractions is the intricate statue of the Pietà in the Vatican Pavilion, a \$2,600,000 building which shows the faith and action of the Catholic Church in the modern world.

As many as 10,000 people an hour pass Michaelangelo's masterpiece and then see the Vatican's other exhibits and pause to pray in a modern-style chapel.

Other religious exhibits include a Protestant-Orthodox Center where 20 denominations are represented, a Russian Orthodox chapel — a replica of one built in California in 1823, a Mormon Pavilion built to resemble that denomination's Temple in Salt Lake City, a Billy Graham Evangelistic Center, Christian Science Pavilion, a Jewish exhibit in the American-Israeli Pavilion, Sermons from Science and a Wycliffe Bible exhibit.



Pope Gets Pietà Medal

Vatican City — (RNS) — Com. a medal commemorating the mander Luigi Pizzorni, pres. latter's meeting with Ecumenical Association, presented Pope Paul VI with the first copy of a medal struck to commemorate the arrival of Michelangelo's Pietà at the New York World's Fair.

The medal shows the famous statue on one side, and on the other a panoramic view of the New York skyline, with the Latin inscription, "Univ. Expositio Neo-Eboracensis MCM. LXIV." Commander Pizzorni made the presentation during a private audience granted by the Pope. He also gave the pontiff the medal.
