Six to Celebrate Jubilees

Six priests of the Rochester Diocese will mark their fortieth anniversaries in the priesthood this spring.

They are:

Fr. Devereaux, pastor of St. Columba's Church, Caledonia, and St. Patrick's Church, Mumfordsville.

Fr. Hogan, pastor of St. Gregory's Church, Marion.

Fr. Mooney, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Aurora, and St. Michael's Church, Union Springs.

Fr. Margrett, assistant pastor at St. Ambrose Church, Rochester.

Fr. Manley, in residence at St. Ann's Home, Rochester.

Anniversary observances and a brief biography of each jubilarian are as follows:

FATHER DEVEREAUX will celebrate his anniversary Mass at St. Columba's Church, Caledonia, Sunday, May 24, at 10 a.m. Rev. Charles Curran will preach the jubilee sermon.

Fr. Devereaux this year is also marking his twentieth year as pastor of the Caledonia and Mumfordsville parishes.

He was born in Rochester, September 15, 1896, the son of the late James J. and Margaret Griffin Devereaux. He attended Blessed Sacrament school, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminary.

He was ordained in old St. Patrick's Cathedral by Bishop Daniel J. Curley of Syracuse June 7, 1924.

He served as assistant pastor at St. Patrick's Church, Seneca Falls; St. Mary's, Elmira; Sacred Heart, Rochester; St. Mary's, Canandaigua; and Holy Apostles, Rochester.

He was named pastor of Holy Angels Church, Nunda, and Holy Name Church, Groveland, in 1940 and to his present pastorate in 1944. Under his direction, parish properties have been renovated and modernized.

FATHER HOGAN will celebrate his jubilee Mass at St. Gregory's Church, Marion, Sunday, June 7, at 11 a.m.

No other observance is planned.

Father Hogan is nationally known for his success in conducting instruction and as an author, especially on patristic subjects. He is also noted for his interest in gardening, art collecting and interior decorating.

He was born in Rochester, March 27, 1896, the son of the late George S. and Anna A. Schubarth Hogan. He attended Corpus Christi school, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's seminaries.

He was ordained in old St. Patrick's Cathedral by Bishop Daniel J. Curley of Syracuse June 7, 1924.

He served as assistant pastor at Sacred Heart Church, now the Cathedral, from 1924 to 1931. He then became chaplain at Sacred Heart Academy and was also assigned as chaplain to Catholic students at the women's college of the University of Rochester, at the Eastman School of Music and at the dental school.

He was named pastor of St. James Church, Trumansburg, in 1935 and of St. Mary's Church, Geneva, in 1946. He then became pastor of St. James Church, Waverly, and was

Father Manley, well known to scores of priests of the Diocese as their seminary professor of Greek and Latin, has also served four parishes besides his present, Aurora, and Union Springs churches.

He was born in Geneva March 13, 1896, the son of the late Henry C. and Mary J. Maloney Manley. He attended St. Stephen's school, Geneva High School, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.

He was ordained in old St. Patrick's Cathedral by Bishop Daniel J. Curley of Syracuse June 7, 1924.

He served as assistant pastor at St. Mary's Church, Auburn, and St. Bridget's Church, Rochester.

He organized the diocesan Society for the Propagation of the Faith and named its first director in 1926. During his eleven years as director he visited missionaries abroad and developed "fraternal" in the Church's mission work locally to make the Rochester Diocese one of the nation's leading contributors to the mission cause.

Father Mooney arranged for the Carmelite nuns to establish a convent in Rochester in 1930 and served as their chaplain for seven years.

Also at that same time, at the direction of Cardinal Mooney, Rochester's fourth bishop, Father Mooney pioneered in interfaith "dialogue" in an historic series of talks with Protestant minister, Rev. Dr. Justin Wroe Nixon, broadcast by radio station WYHAM.

In 1931, Father Mooney resigned the Catholic Courier to make it the official diocesan
