The Arts Enrichment Program, scheduled from July 8 to July 31, will present "America the Beautiful" in music, literature, art and music. Field trips, discussion groups, and guest speakers will be included in the program which will be presented both at Nazareth Hall Cadet School and Our Lady of Lourdes School.

"It is our earnest wish," said Reverend Mother Agnes Cecilia in making the announcement, "that our program will stimulate interest in the arts, nurture the seeds of creativity and channel the energies of these children into artistic productivity."

THE SESSIONS, which will be held from 8:20 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. will be climaxed on August 1 by a "Summer Pageant of Skills," developed during the course. Parents and friends will be welcome to attend this session and the class period on July 24.

Tuition will be \$30.00. Other programs to be conducted during the summer by the Sisters of St. Joseph will be in remedial reading and modern mathematics.

Centers for the Remedial Reading Program will be in the following schools: Blessed Sacrament, Nazareth Hall, Our Lady of Good Counsel, St. Jerome, East Rochester, and Immaculate Conception, Ithaca. Students from grades 4 to 8 will be eligible for the sessions which will be conducted from 8:30 to 9:45 a.m. and 10 to 11:15 a.m. Tuition will be \$25.00.

Students from the seventh grade will participate in modern mathematics program scheduled at Nazareth Hall and Our Lady of Lourdes. Class hours will be the same as those for the Remedial Reading Program. Tuition, \$25.00.

Children may register at their own parish school or at the school they will attend in the summer.

She was a member of the Rosary Society of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church of Auxiliary No. 43, Knights of St. John, and the Order of Martin.

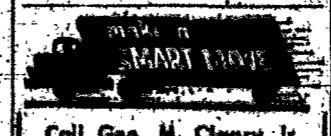
In addition to Father Merkel, Mrs. Merkel is survived by five daughters, Mrs. Anna Mae Taylor.
