FATHER CONNELL will celebrate his jubilee Mass at the chapel of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Cancer Home, Atlanta, Thursday, May 28, at 11:30 a.m.

He served as curate in four parishes of the Rochester Diocese prior to his going to Georgia—St. Michael's, Penn Yan; Holy Cross, Rochester; Holy Apostles, Rochester; and St. Cecilia's Church, Elmira.

His assignments in the Atlanta, Georgia, archdiocese have included assistant pastor at St. Patrick's Church, Augusta, and assistant chaplain at Fort Gordon, administrator at St. Mary's Church, Rome, and St. Peter's Church, LaGrange, as also chaplain at Shorter College and for the Warm Springs Falls Rehabilitation.
