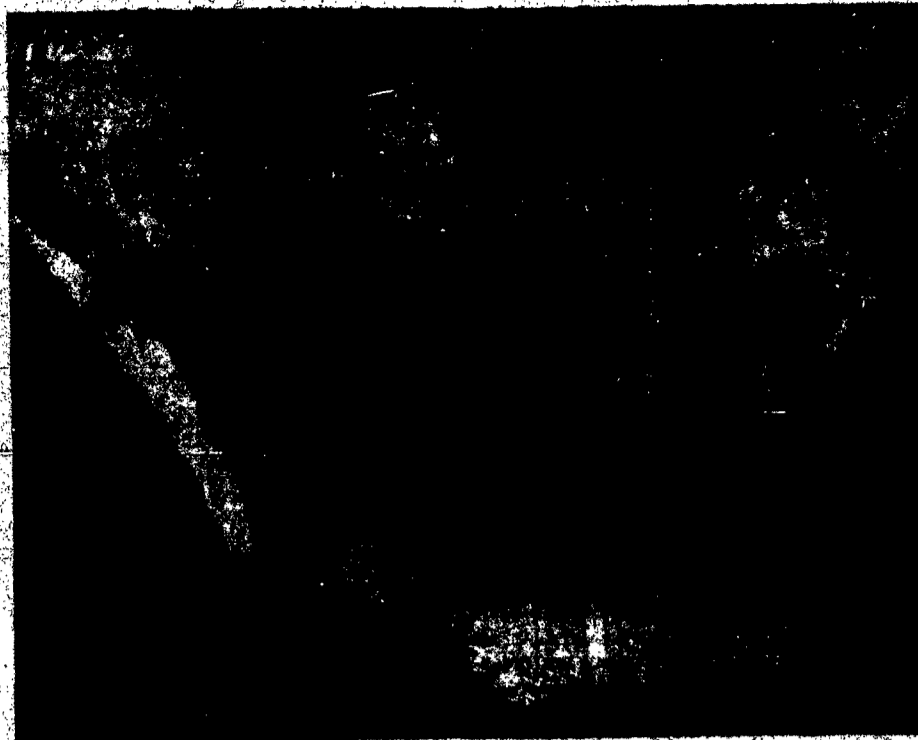
Annual Knights of Equity Court No. 10, Communism and Breakfast will be held Sunday May 24.
