Senior Joan Farmer has been awarded an \$800 scholarship by the Knights of Columbus. It was announced this week at Notre Dame High School, Elmira.

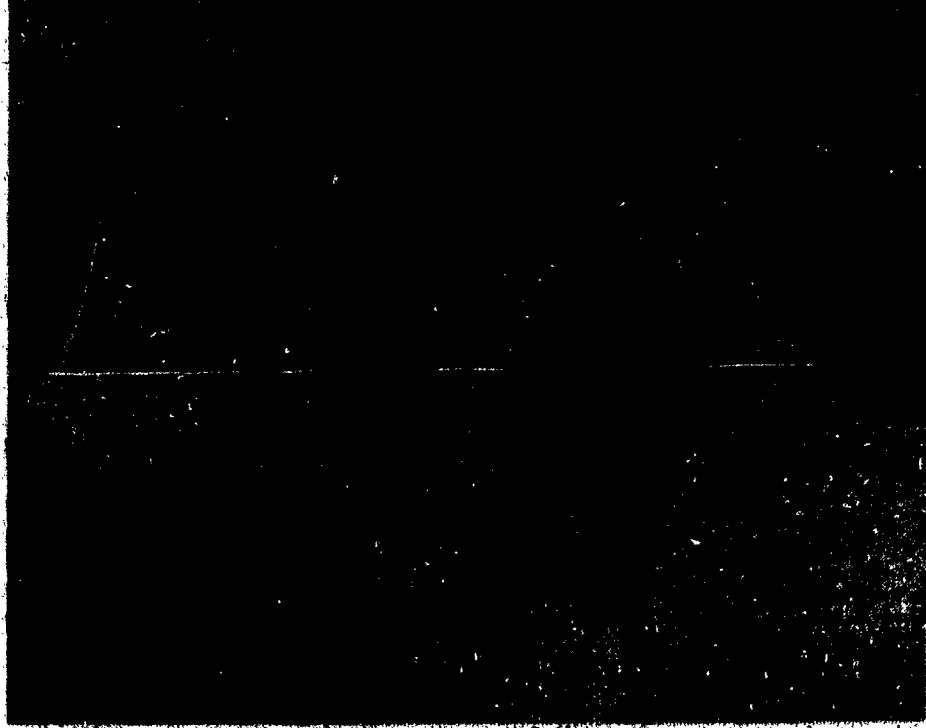
