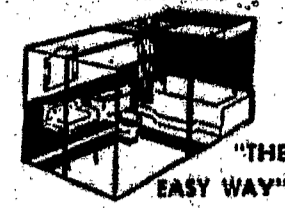

**Inter-Faith Committee Formed In Auburn**

Auburn—Clergy of the Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Jewish and a major part of the Protestant faiths have announced the formation of a permanent Inter-Faith Committee for Auburn and surrounding area.

**THE PURPOSE** of the group is to hold first a to make available to the mayor and city council and the city at large the assistance of all major religious groups in matters affecting the common good.
