

Papal Blessing, Priests Attend Orthodox Rite

Kottayam, India — (NC) — Pope Paul VI sent "greetings of warm brotherly gladness" to the new Jacobite Catholics of the East on the occasion of his consecration here, and several Roman Catholic priests attended the ceremonies.

The new Catholics, metropolitan of the Kerala-centered church of India and second in command in the Oriental Rite separated from Roman Catholicism since the 6th century, was consecrated by the church's head, Ignatius Mar Jackob III, Patriarch of Antioch.

Augustin Cardinal Bea, S.J., Vatican head of the Secretariat for Promoting Christian Unity, communicated the Pope's greetings to the Catholics, Basilios Mar Timotheos Augen.

Murder Charged In Police Action

Salon — (NC) — The trial of Maj. Dang Sy, Catholic officer accused of "murdering" eight Buddhists in Hue on May 8, 1963, begins June 2 in Saigon, according to well informed sources.

Up to May 29, however, the government had not announced the date or place of the trial.

THE EIGHT persons were killed when security forces under Maj. Dang Sy's command were trying to disperse a crowd of Buddhist demonstrators in incident riot outside the Hue government radio station.

The government announced originally that the trial would be held in Hue, where Buddhist partisans have been fanatical flames of prejudice for weeks. The trial was planned for the days just preceding the feast of Buddha's birthday (May 26).

Catholics protested strongly. It is understood that some foreign diplomats urged the government to alter plans. The trial was postponed until after the festival, but word came it would be only two days after it and Hue would be the place.

Catholics in the Saigon archdiocese were on the point of staging a protest demonstration

on May 24, but postponed it at the request of Archbishop Paul Nguyen van Dinh of Saigon.

The June 2 date and the change of venue to Saigon meet part of the Catholic objections. They still maintain that the Revolutionary Court trials held so far have been marked by unfair procedure. They say the major should be tried by a regular military court, if at all, and that his immediate military superiors should be tried with him. These are non-negotiable demands.

Rome OK's Catholic Edition of RSV Bible

Edinburgh, — (NC) — A New Testament that combines Catholic and Protestant scholarship moved close to publication here with the issuance of the Key approval by a Catholic Church authority.

A Catholic edition of the American Protestant Revised Standard Version of the New Testament was given a full imprimatur by Archbishop Gordon J. Gray of St. Andrew's and Edinburgh, in whose diocese the publishers, Thomas Nelson and Sons, are located.

Work on the Old Testament segment is said to be well advanced, and this joint Catholic-Protestant effort will soon be ready for the press.

When it appears it will be the first English Bible translated straight from the Hebrew and Greek texts with Catholic approval.

Pope Paul Describes Our Lady

Mary, Mother of The Church

Vatican City — (NC) — Our Lady is the ideal figure of the Church, Pope Paul VI told thousands of persons gathered in St. Peter's Basilica for his weekly general audience. He called her "Mother of the Church."

The Pope spoke on the re-

lationship between Mary and the Church, saying it is "a doctrinal theme of greatest importance because of the discussions in the religious world and in the Vatican Council, a theme of great immediate value."

Episcopal Cleric Sees 'Converging' in Century

Providence, — (RNS) — A Protestant Episcopal delegate-observer to the Second Vatican Council noted here that Anglican and Roman Catholic have "converged" for 400 years, but it would be another century before the paths converged.

Dr. Frederick C. Grant, a retired theologian who represented the worldwide Anglican communion at the opening session of the Council, said that Catholic liturgical experts are "making a very serious study of the Anglican Book of Common Prayer and that there is a real desire on the part of Catholics for greater understanding of Protestant and Anglican."

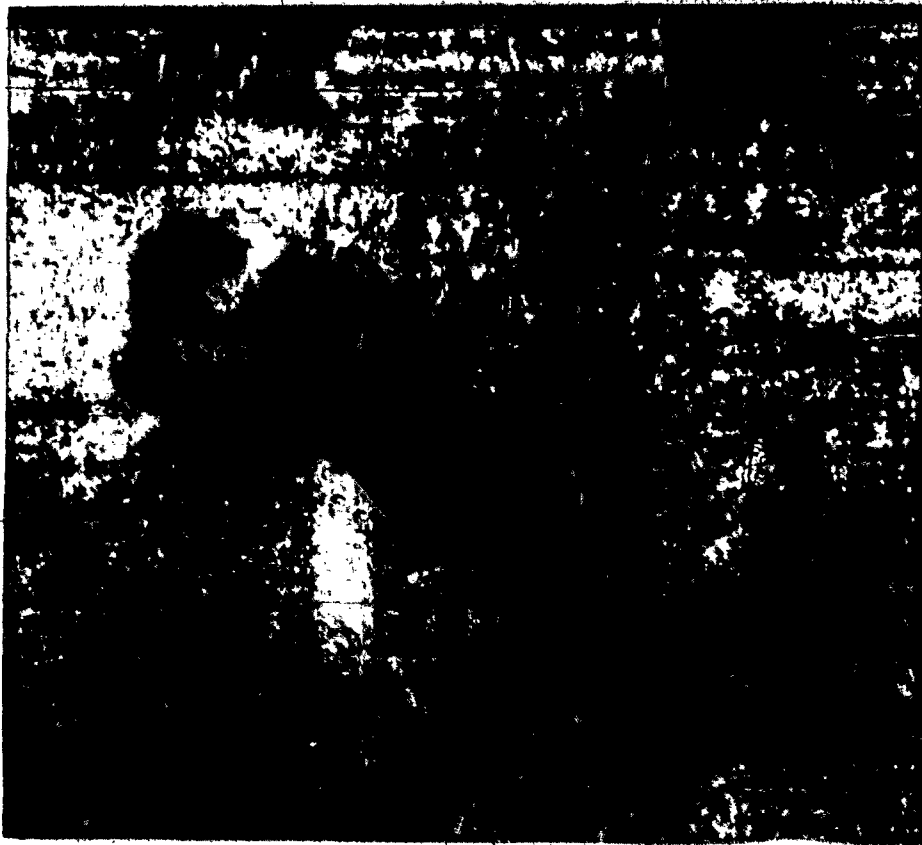
Addressing the annual meeting of the Episcopal Church Women of the Diocese of Rhode Island, Dr. Grant reported that the Catholic Church "is making a bid for the laity" — especially the working people — by planning to shorten the Mass.

Pope John's Anniversary

Vatican City — (RNS) — A Solemn Pontifical Memorial Mass for the repose of the soul of Pope John XXIII will be sung in St. Peter's Basilica on June 3, the first anniversary of his death, a Vatican announcement said.

The Mass will be celebrated by Cardinal Urbani, Patriarch of Venice, and the absolution will be imparted by Pope Paul VI.

The congregation is expected to include all the cardinals, archbishops and bishops in Rome, as well as numerous other high-ranking ecclesiastics.



Pope John died a year ago Wednesday, June 3. The world mourned him as did this weeping man who knelt in a drenching rain in front of St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican. Pope Paul, elected three weeks later, pledged himself to continue the program of Pope John, a task of making the Catholic Church more meaningful in the modern world.

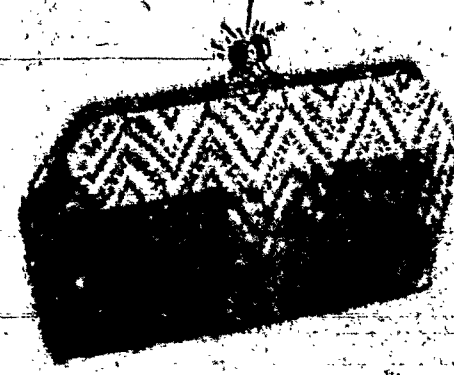

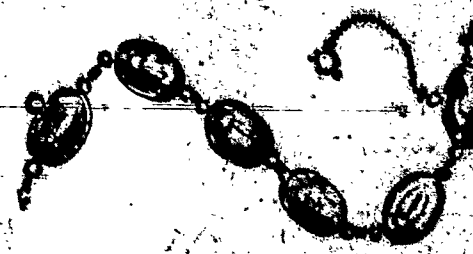
